SUPERVISOR MAGSIG COMMENTED ON THE LIKELY SHUT-DOWN OF RIO BRAVO, A LARGE BIOMASS FACILITY LOCATED IN DISTRICT 4: TREES REMOVED DUE TO TREE MORTALITY OR BEING HIGH-HAZARD HAVE BEEN HAULED TO THAT SITE FOR DISPOSAL; THE SITE MAY BE THE ONLY SUCH FACILITY LEFT IN FRESNO COUNTY; IT GENERATES 24 TO 25 MEGAWATTS OF POWER; FARMERS DISPOSE OF THEIR CLIPPINGS AND OTHER MATERIALS THERE; HE IS CONCERNED THAT, IF THE COUNTY WILL NO LONGER HAVE BIOMASS FACILITIES AND THERE WILL BE NO OPTIONS TO DISPOSE OF LARGE WOOD WASTE, THEN THAT WASTE WILL BE SENT TO THE LANDFILL, CAUSING ISSUES FOR THE COUNTY AS THE CURRENT DIVERSION PLANS REQUIRE THE COUNTY TO DIVERT A CERTAIN AMOUNT OF WASTE FROM LANDFILLS; THE DIVERSION PLANS ALSO NOTE THAT RIO BRAVO ASSISTS IN DIVERTING GREEN WASTE FROM THE LANDFILL; AND TRASH HAULERS HAVE ALREADY CONTACTED HIM OF THE POTENTIAL NEGATIVE EFFECTS OF RIO BRAVO CLOSING. SUPERVISOR MAGSIG SUGGESTED TO THE BOARD THAT THEY ENCOURAGE THE CALIFORNIA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION (CPUC), SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON, PG&E AND THE STATE TO KEEP RIO BRAVO OPEN AND TO DO SO AS SOON AS POSSIBLE AS THE FACILITY IS SET TO CLOSE ON OCTOBER 1. SUPERVISOR MENDES COMMENTED ON THE STATE'S CURRENT POSITION AS TO WHY RIO BRAVO IS CLOSING. CHAIRMAN PACHECO, WITH THE CONSENSUS OF THE BOARD, DIRECTED CAO NERLAND TO DRAFT A LETTER TO THE APPROPRIATE AGENCIES, PER SUPERVISOR MAGSIG, EXPRESSING THE BOARD'S SUPPORT FOR RIO BRAVO REMAINING A VIABLE OPTION FOR THE COUNTY OF FRESNO. CAO NERLAND AGREED AND WILL INCLUDE IN THE LETTER THE IMPACTS THE CLOSURE WILL HAVE, BOTH WITHIN AND OUTSIDE OF THE COUNTY. VICE CHAIRMAN QUINTERO REPORTED ON ATTENDING A RIBBON-CUTTING CEREMONY LAST WEEK FOR THE WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT BOARD, WHICH, AFTER CLOSING THEIR MANCHESTER CENTER LOCATION, HAS NOW OPENED A 33,000 SQ. FT. BUILDING ON THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SHAW AND MARKS, INCREASING THEIR ABILITY TO PROVIDE JOB TRAINING FOR BUILDING TRADES AS WELL OTHER TYPES OF TRAINING FOR THOSE WANTING TO ENTER THE JOB MARKET OR IMPROVE THEIR CURRENT SALARIES AND WILL GREATLY HELP THE COMMUNITY LOCALLY
