QUARTERLY ACTIVITY REPORT

This report summarizes the agreement requirements between the County of Fresno and the Fresno County Economic Development Corporation (EDC).

Division Mission

To market Fresno County as the premier location for business prosperity.

Fresno County EDC Services

The Economic Development Corporation serving Fresno County is a nonprofit organization established to market Fresno County as the premier location for business prosperity. We facilitate site selection for new businesses within Fresno County and assist in the retention and expansion of businesses through our alliance with collaborative partners and resources.

The EDC agrees to the following services:

1. Provide site visits to businesses interested in locating in Fresno County. The EDC will report the number of site visits including names of the business (unless the business expressly requests to remain anonymous), type of industry, and location in the quarterly report to County;
2. The EDC will provide technical assistance to businesses staying in Fresno County or expanding their operations;
3. The EDC will allow County access to industrial inventory.
4. The EDC will maintain, monitor, and draft any required revisions of the County's Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) for approval by the County and help the County achieve the economic development objectives of the CEDS; and
5. The EDC, in coordination with the County Administrative Office, will help implement policies and programs from the Economic Development Element of the County of Fresno General Plan.

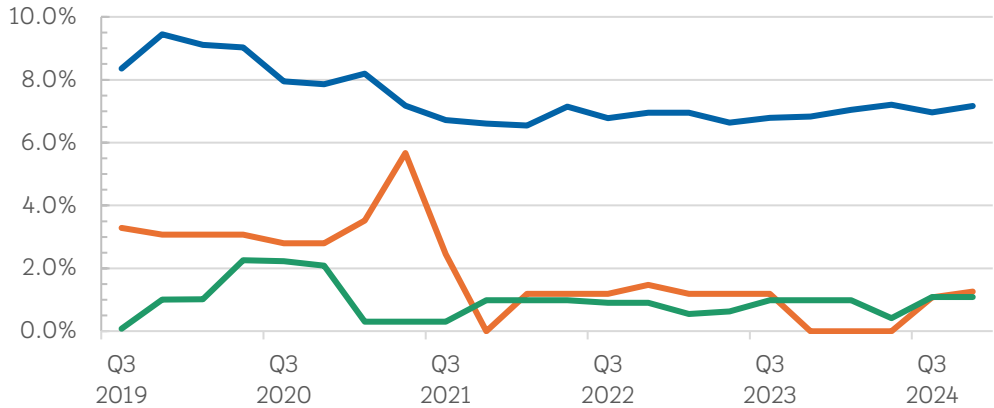

April 2024

New Employment Opportunities: Job Fair

Fresno County EDC and County of Fresno Department of Social Services (DSS) held a NEO Program Job Fair at the Manchester Center on April 11, 2024. With over 20 employers and resource centers in attendance, and more than 200 job seekers, this job fair was an event buzzing with opportunities. Thank you to the Manchester Center for sponsoring the venue and Cricket Wireless for providing internet access.

The NEO team renewed two new employers, First Health Medical Group and Family is Why, into the NEO program. Furthermore, the NEO program successfully placed 24 clients from the Department of Social Services into suitable positions.

Semiconductor Investment Opportunities with SEMI

As a follow-up from SEMI President/CEO Ajit Manocha's visit to Fresno State in February, EDC and Fresno State coordinated a meeting with local partners to further our partnership with SEMI. SEMI is a global association comprised of 3,000-member semiconductor companies that are committed to advancing global electronics design and manufacturing supply chain. Fresno Mayor Jerry Dyer, Clovis Mayor Lynne Ashbeck, Fresno State, EDC staff and local partners discussed investments underway in the region, local incentives, university assets, future available real estate and workforce development programs that can be tailored to meet the industry's needs. Mr. Manocha and staff presented the resources available to SEMI members and commitment to supporting the Central Valley on participating in the semiconductor supply chain. Our coalition agreed to participate at SEMI's Semicon West Conference in San Francisco in July where Mr. Manocha and local leaders will execute an MOU to foster future collaborations.

Sierra San Joaquin Jobs: Catalyst RFP Technical Assistance

Our staff devoted time, expertise, and shared resources with several partner organizations completing Catalyst Request for Proposals (RFP). Through the State of California Jobs First initiative, Catalyst funding is "seed money" for projects that support disinvested and disadvantaged communities, have a local or regional scope, and aim to attract additional state, federal, or philanthropic funding -- with the objective of fostering an inclusive, resilient, sustainable economy that creates jobs and provides equitable economic access to across the Central San Joaquin Valley.

Client Services Manager, Julian Ramos, attended the Site Selectors Guild (SSG) Annual Conference in Nashville, TN. The SSG is the only association of the world's foremost professional site selection consultants. Guild members provide location strategy to corporations across the globe and for every industry, sector and function. Each year, the Guild holds its marquee Annual Conference event with all global Guild members in attendance. The cornerstone of the Annual Conference is knowledge sharing, an interactive exchange of ideas and networking between Guild members and economic developers and investment promotion professionals from around the world.

As Gold Sponsors with partners at TeamCalifornia, Fresno County EDC engaged with location experts from all around the world and discussed the future of economic development, site selection, and global investment.

MAY 2024

New Employment Opportunities (NEO)

The NEO program, in partnership with Department of Social Services (DSS), successfully placed 22 new job seekers into employment and have 5 new employers currently in process to participate in the NEO program. We will continue our efforts to place even more individuals into employment. The NEO program has positively impacted those who have found employment through its initiatives. Below is a success story from a job seeker participant, serving as a testament to the program's effectiveness.

John C. was a previous graduate from our John R. Lawson Truck Driver training program cohort 46. He became interested in trucking after reading books about it. He reports enjoying the program and all that it has brought to him. John began looking for work after completing the program, however, he was having difficulty. He was contacted when a business called Pleasant Mattress Inc., a NEO employer, expressed a need for workers through our NEO program. John was placed there and has found his experience thus far to be educational and enjoyable. He shares that he is learning many things about manufacturing mattresses and driving trucks.

John has said that he has received support from Fresno Department of Social Services (DSS), Economic Development Corporation (EDC), and the instructors from the Truck Drivers Training program with West Hills. His life has been impacted positively by allowing him to become more financially stable, networking, developing a more positive outlook and furthering his skills. He has been recommending the program to others around him. He feels that people need to “get up and do something”. John has even volunteered to talk to potential candidates. His words to them would be, “sit on the curb or get in and play.” He feels that if they want to make moves to become a truck driver, they need to make it a priority and follow through.

Healthcare Sector Partnership & Potential Training Development

EDC staff met with executive representatives of a large medical provider to discuss potential training pathways for CNA's, LVN's and other in-demand occupations utilizing the New Employment Opportunities, and potentially, Good Jobs Challenge (GJC) programs. Ongoing conversations are taking place with the Economic Development Administration in Washington, DC, to include healthcare as a designated sector within the GJC program. If successful, this inclusion would facilitate the creation of targeted training opportunities.

International Council of Shopping Centers (ICSC) National Conference: Las Vegas

Lauren Nikkel and Julian Ramos attended ICSC in Las Vegas, Nevada. The national conference brings together the best in retail, commercial brokering, and real estate development alongside municipalities and local economic development organizations for the purpose of advancing the marketplace industry. Using AI-enabled attractions, we conducted strategic outreach and scheduled meetings with highly requested retailers on behalf of the metro Fresno area and our rural cities. Special thanks to Robin Reimold and TeamCalifornia for acting as a home base of operations.

Sierra San Joaquin (S2J2) Jobs First: Spring Sprint Kickoff

On May 8th, Will Oliver, Lauren Nikkel, and Julian Ramos participated in the Sierra San Joaquin (S2J2) Jobs First Spring Sprint Kickoff, spearheaded by the Central Valley Community Foundation. Fresno County EDC has supported the S2J2 Jobs First, formerly known as Valley Jobs First, initiative since its inception in 2022.

This event launched an ambitious eight-week sprint to launch a Regional Investment Plan strategy, and featured an initial convening of eight work groups, aiming to foster quality job creation, ensure equitable opportunities, and promote environmental stewardship in the four-county region. Over 300 representatives from Madera, Fresno, Tulare, and Kings Counties attended the kickoff event held at the Madera Fairgrounds.

Over the next several weeks, Fresno County EDC will serve as a convener for the Climate Solutions workgroup, as well as participate in the Broadband, EV/Fleet Vehicles, and Circular Manufacturing workgroups.



WorkCon 2024: California Workforce Association

Chris Zeitz, Jackie Cuevas, and Nicole Teraoka attended the California Workforce Association's annual workforce practitioners conference, WorkCon. This year's theme, Bridging the Gap, benefited attendees who are interested in helping people obtain sustainable employment and recognize the need for workforce development agencies to work together within strategic partnerships.

JUNE 2024

Resident Leaders for Equitable Economic Development (RLEED)

On June 22nd and June 23rd, the Fresno Resident Leadership group met at the Valley Dream Center to discuss the future of the group and how the group envisions the working relationship with the Fresno Economic Development Center. An impact evaluation / business consulting startup from Chicago, Lunum, joined the meetings on both days as did Artie Padilla of the Central Valley Community Foundation. Discussions were started on how the group will take on more responsibility in maintaining and facilitating the group and meetings in the future. The meeting schedule for the rest of the year was set, with sessions planned in late August and early November.

California Leadership Hydrogen Summit

Joe Verduzco, Business Attraction Specialist, attended the California Hydrogen Leadership Summit from June 3-4. The summit focused on advancing hydrogen production, use, and storage to support California's decarbonization and air quality goals. It featured discussions on the environmental and economic benefits of renewable hydrogen, infrastructure for zero-emission vehicles, and its impact on environmental justice. Leaders from various sectors gathered to explore hydrogen's role in mitigating climate change, enhancing energy resilience, and driving economic growth.



The Hurd Company – Business Meeting

On June 21st, Will Oliver and Spencer Bremer met with The Hurd Company, a Santa Monica-based ag-tech startup looking to bring their innovative technology to Fresno County. Their technology utilizes agriwaste for cellulose extraction, converting it into a feedstock pulp to sell to apparel manufacturers. Their buyers then use this pulp to make fibers for clothing. We introduced them to Sierra Agra USA, who have a similar process for sourcing feedstock, and toured their facilities. Later in the morning, we visited Fresno State's Jordan Agricultural Research Center, introducing The Hurd Company to our university stakeholders. The Company is looking to open a demo commercial facility near potential suppliers in the Central Valley and aims to be 100% California-sourced. As such, we provided information on production volumes of high-cellulose content crops grown in Fresno County that would be suitable inputs for their operations.

New Employment Opportunities (NEO) Program

The NEO program, in partnership with the Department of Social Services (DSS), has successfully enrolled five new employers, all seeking to place one or more individuals into employment. The NEO program has positively impacted those who have found employment through its initiatives. Below is a success story from a job seeker participant, highlighting the program's effectiveness.

“My children and I were on government assistance for about 8 months. The Department of Social Services (DSS) offered America Works to help assist me with soft skills training to assist with finding employment. There I learned how to find employment, write a professional resume, and accomplish interviews with confidence. In that class I was introduced to the NEO/R2H program which I never had heard of before.

From 2019 to 2022 all my employment was through a temp agency only just hoping one of them would hire me on. Most of them were seasonal and a few were two or three weeks only. I guess I just didn't want to go through the hassle of the orientation or the interview because I wasn't as confident as I am today. I can honestly say I am very happy to have been a part of the NEO program and employed full time. I'm able to pay the rent and provide for my children on my own now.”

I am happy with my current position with Exhibit Supply Co., a job that I found through the NEO program. During the transition period, I was helped with childcare, CalWORKs, CalFresh, a monthly check for gas, and a check for proper work attire from DSS. I started off as a customer service representative, answering calls and emails. Then the position of Shipping and Receiving was given to me and now I am the Manager in Shipping and Receiving. I love meeting new people and with this job I have met so many people with different backgrounds and professions. I went out with the CEO a few times to different events indoors and out around the central valley and now I get to attend by myself. I get to attend monthly mixers with Clovis Chambers, and ribbon cuttings around Fresno and Clovis. For those reasons I am very confident in myself and my work I do with Exhibit Supply and believe there is room for growth not just for myself but for everyone employed with Exhibit Supply.

I would recommend the NEO program to anyone seeking employment. They don't randomly assign you to a position; instead, they align you with the type of work you're seeking and continue to do so until you feel comfortable in your current role. The NEO program will work with you on questions you might come across with employment or concerns within your work and will provide you with resolutions.

My advice to participants considering participating in the program is to not hesitate and just do it. The NEO program is like family, they have someone by your side every step of the way. There is always someone who comes in and checks in with you and don't be afraid to address any questions and concerns you may have about where you are because if you are not happy where you are they will help you find the kind of employer you seek with your experience.”
