Current Program Overview

▶ **Exclusive Service Area Program (ESAP)**

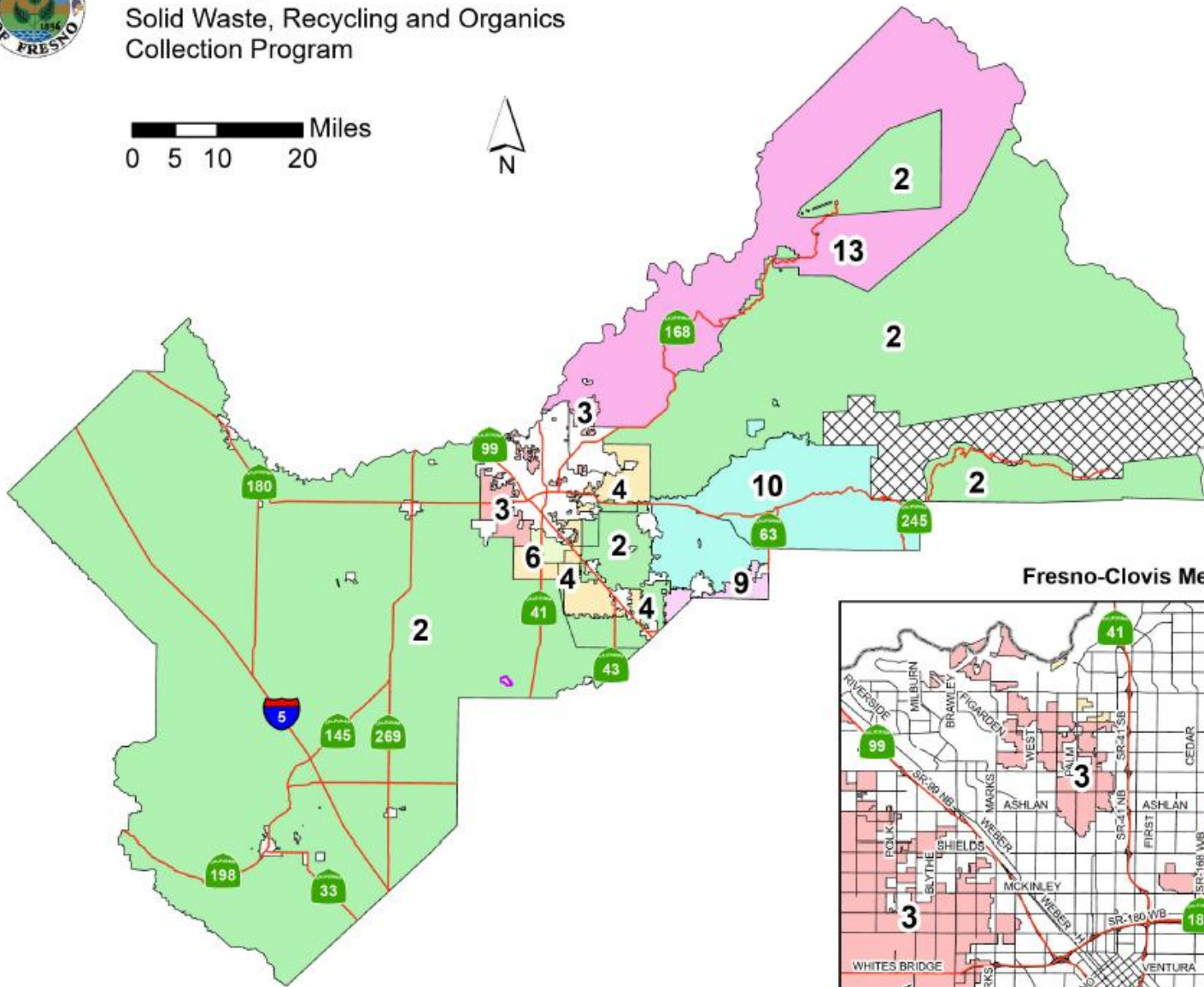
- ▶ Implemented in response to a compliance order received from the State
- ▶ 7 active ESAP haulers with 7 individual service territories
 - ▶ Current agreements expire on February 27, 2028
- ▶ 6 service rate areas
 - ▶ Zones 1, 2A-Existing, 2A-New, 2B, 3A-New, & 3B
- ▶ 3 container curbside collection system in non-waived areas
 - ▶ Zones 2B & 3B are exempt from SB 1383 requirements due to a State-issued low-population waiver
- ▶ Annual Community Clean-Up Drop Off Event available to unincorporated residents once per calendar year
- ▶ Non-mandatory services
 - ▶ Unincorporated Fresno County residents & businesses can choose to self-haul

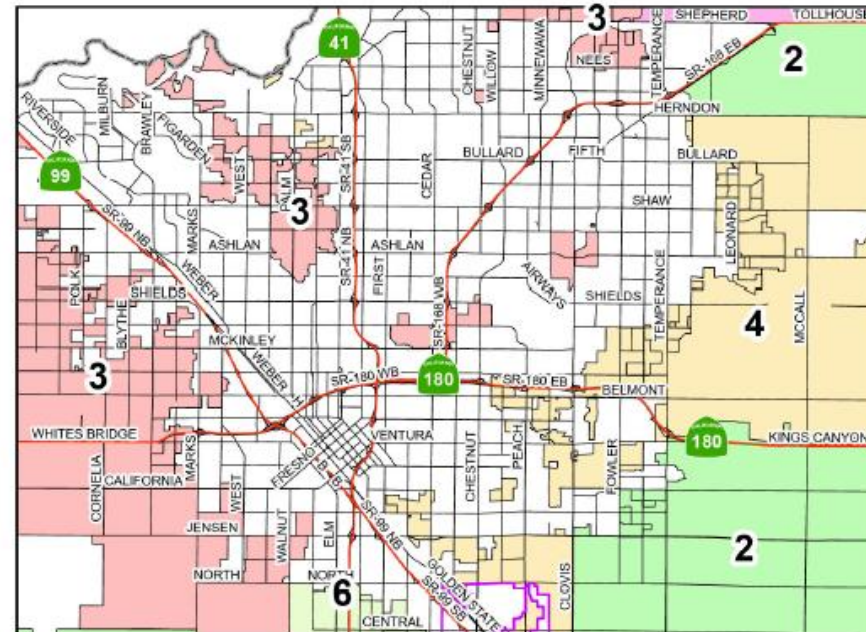

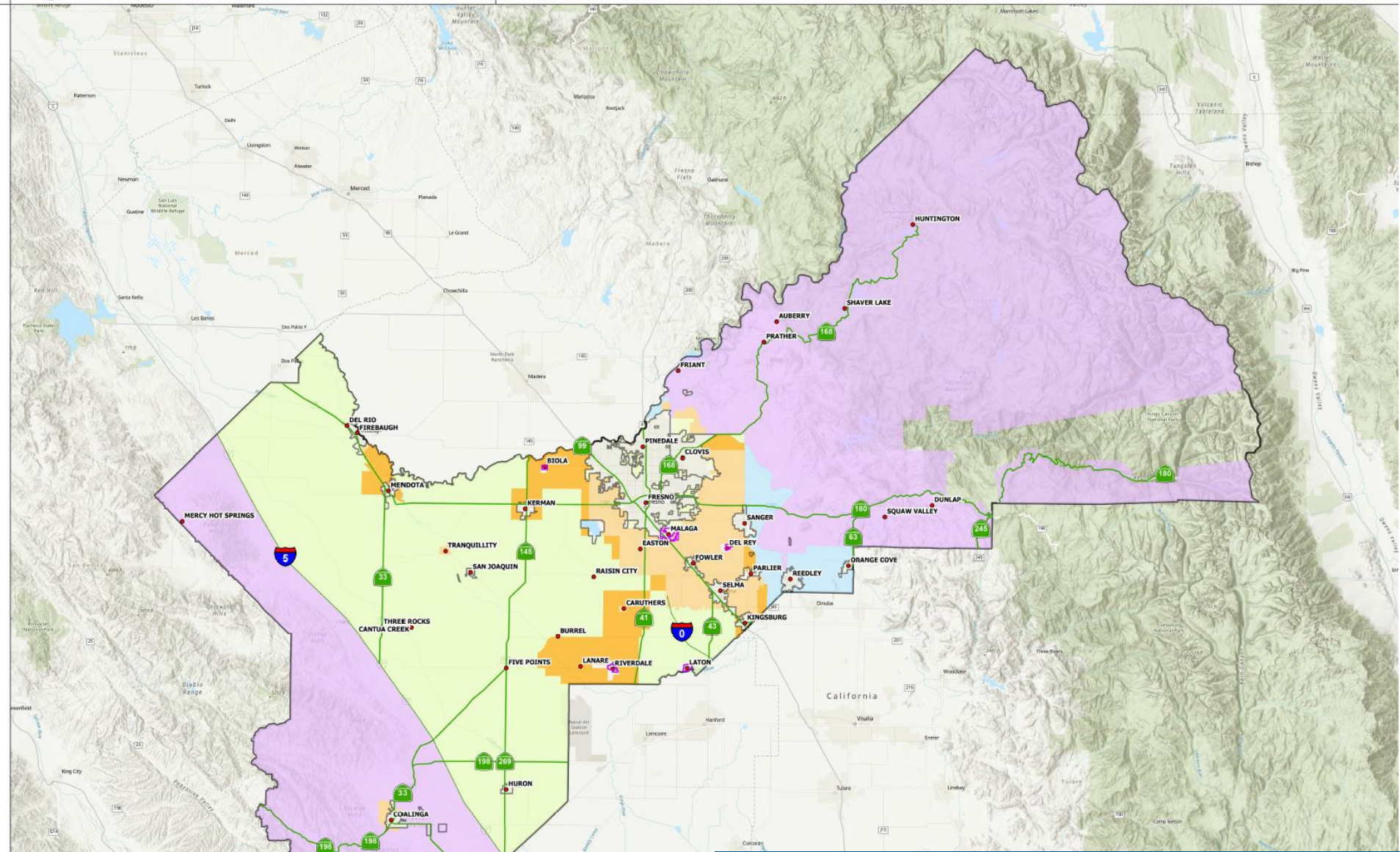

Future Franchise Program Design

Recommended Action 2

- ▶ **Wholly exclusive franchise program design**
 - ▶ Single contractor provides countywide services
 - ▶ Service territory and rate areas will be redefined based on various factors (e.g., population density, elevation, etc.)
 - ▶ Benefits include increased compliance and administrative efficiencies for the County, and added service value for customers (e.g., lower rates, discounted service, redesigned drop-off program, etc.)

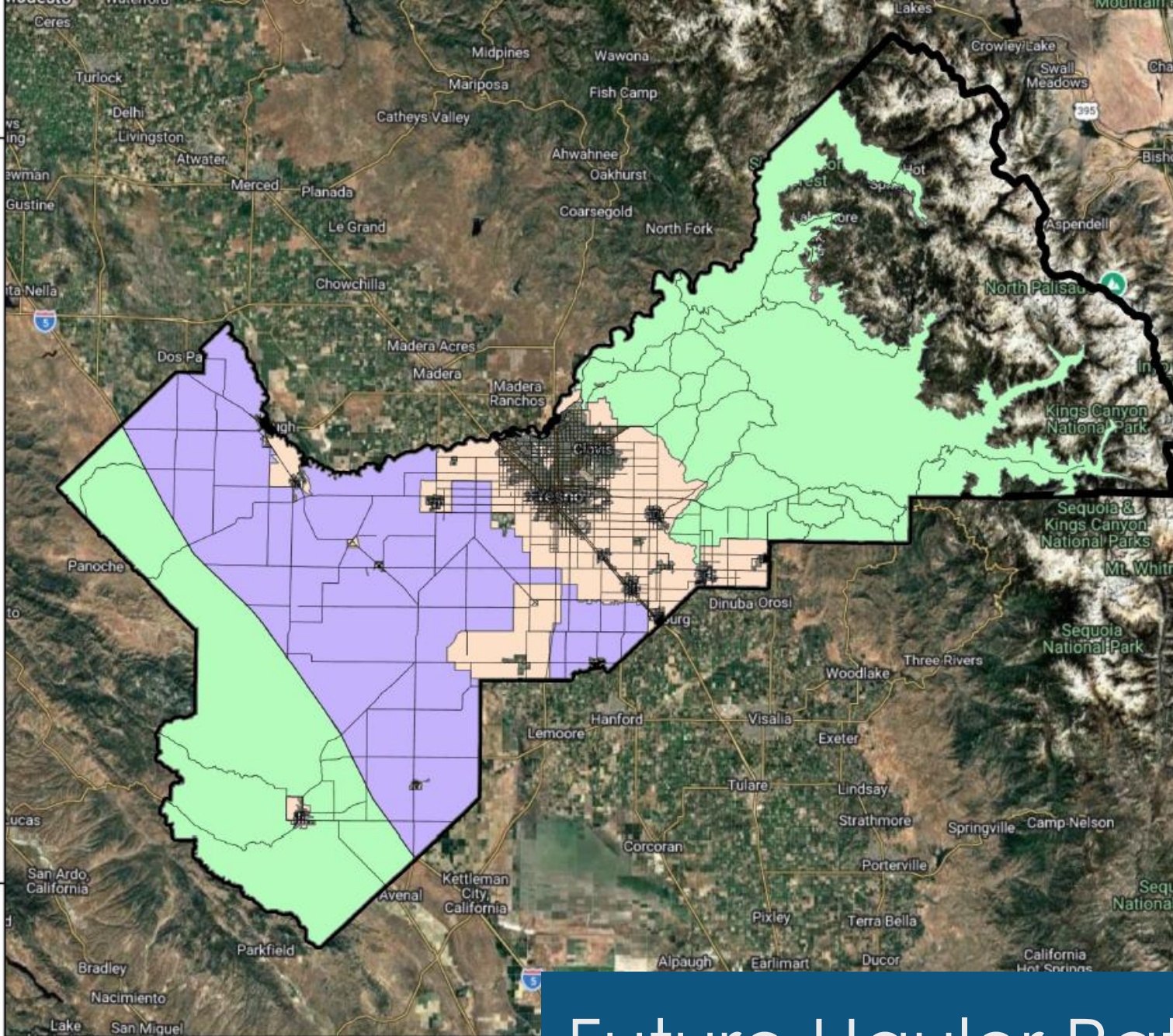
ESAP Proposed map 2028

Implementation of Mandatory Services

Recommended Action 3

- ▶ **Implement Mandatory Collection Services in Zone 1** (Formerly Zones 1, 2A-Existing, 2A-New, & 3A)
 - ▶ Residents & businesses in select areas within unincorporated Fresno County must subscribe to curbside collection services
 - ▶ Select areas include all areas that are mandated to have an organics container per SB 1383
 - ▶ Increases compliance with State regulations & diversion goals, while also potentially lowering customer rates
 - ▶ Supports efforts to reduce illegal dumping
 - ▶ New ordinance will need to be adopted
 - ▶ Prop 218



Method of Procurement

Recommended Action 4

► **Competitive Bidding Process**

- Request for Proposal (RFP)
- Maintain a strong negotiating position
- Increases potential for regulatory compliance
