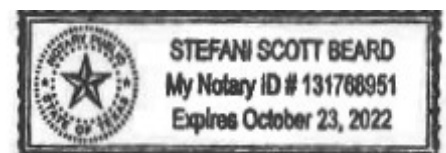

Dear Chairman Pacheco and Board Members,

This comment is in relation to agenda item 8. I am a resident of Fresno County and the Interim Immigrants' Rights Program Director at the ACLU of Northern California. A few months ago, the ACLU published a report revealing the many ways in which sheriffs throughout the Central Valley, including Fresno County, have circumvented pro-immigrant state laws in order to continue to hand community members to ICE. This is a voluntary practice that results in family separation.

Our findings unearthed the Fresno County Sheriff's Office's eagerness to work with ICE agents to craft a system that would both allow them to continue to transfer people to ICE and to do so in a manner that goes unreported.

For example, in 2018 and 2019, Sheriff Mims reportedly received a total of 1,073 detainees from ICE. Yet, at TRUTH Act forums for each of those years, she announced she had not responded to any ICE detainees or notification requests—despite that fact that her office had put in place a robust system (now discontinued) in which officials faxed custody information to ICE for most all individuals with an ICE detainer. We also found that, in an attempt to sidestep the Values Act's prohibition on transferring people without certain criminal histories to ICE, the Fresno County Sheriff's Office proposed ICE arrest people in a locked, non-public area of the jail, so that any ICE arrests in that area would not have to be publicly reported as a transfer of custody.

We call on the sheriff to end the voluntary practice of custody transfers to ICE. No level of transparency can heal the damage that this practice continues to inflict on the lives of our immigrant community.
