ANNUAL "CLIMB TO KAISER" BICYCLING EVENT

WHEREAS, the non-profit Fresno Cycling Club will hold the 44th Annual "Climb to Kaiser" event, which will involve over 14,000 feet of climbing during the 155 mile route; and

WHEREAS, the "Climb to Kaiser" event, previously rated as one of the ten toughest rides in America by *Bicycling* magazine, will be held on Saturday, June 27, 2020; and

WHEREAS, over 200 cyclists will attempt the Kaiser route, which will take riders over such climbs as Burrough Valley Road, Old Tollhouse Road, Huntington Lake Road and Kaiser Pass Road; and

WHEREAS, participants from California, Nevada, Colorado, Washington, Tennessee, New York, and Singapore will be supported by almost 200 volunteers during this Fresno County event; and


WHEREAS, the Fresno Cycling Club has applied to the State of California to conduct the "Climb to Kaiser" bicycling event on State property; and

WHEREAS, the "Climb to Kaiser" bicycling event may temporarily impede and restrict the free passage of traffic over State Highway Route 168 on Saturday, June 27, 2020 between Clovis and Kaiser Pass between the hours of 5:30 a.m. and 10:00 p.m.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Fresno County Board of Supervisors hereby approves and consents to the proposed "Climb to Kaiser" bicycling event and recommends approval of and consents to the proposed restriction of State Highway Route 168 upon terms and conditions deemed appropriate and necessary by the State of California, Department of Transportation.
