General Description of Boating Safety and Enforcement Programs (attachment A)

The Fresno County Sheriff-Coroner's Boating Safety Unit consists of a full-time, year-round Sergeant and two Deputy Sheriff's. The Unit hires four additional Deputy Sheriffs and six to eight paid Reserve Deputy Sheriff's from May through September.

During the summer boating season, six 2-person teams patrol 40 hours per week on the County's 11 waterways. Two lakes (Shaver and Pine Flat) and the Kings River are patrolled full time by these Deputies (total of 160 man hours each per week). Shaver Lake, Pine Flat Lake, and the Kings River account for 5 of our 6 two-person teams. The 6th two-person team patrols all of the other lakes and waterways in the County on a part time, as-need basis. The busiest of these part time waterways are Redinger Lake, Huntington Lake and the San Joaquin River.

The land around Huntington Lake is patrolled by a Deputy Sheriff in a Patrol vehicle through a contract with the US Forest Service. This Deputy receives Dept. of Boating and Waterways training, but is not a member of, the Boating Unit.

The Boating Unit enforces all Federal, State and County regulations relating to all water and boating activities.

The Boating Unit is responsible for all water related search and rescues, drowned person recoveries and vessel accident investigations.

The Boating Unit is heavily involved in teaching the AquaSmart program to school children. The Boating Unit is also a member of the Fresno County Water Safety Committee and San Joaquin River Conservancy. We attend many civic, school, church and community events.
