The County of Fresno (County) has identified the need for a more comprehensive plan to select local communities in which to focus efforts on infrastructure project identification and implementation. The projects that are generated by this study will be considered for selection for state and federal grants such as the Active Transportation Program (ATP), Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality program (CMAQ), Surface Transportation Block Grant program (STBG), and others.

The funding, if awarded, will be used to hire a consultant who will be tasked with investigating and analyzing the needs of the County's Disadvantaged Unincorporated Communities (DUCs) and provide the necessary information to identify those areas within the County most in need of infrastructure improvements. The County will make available supplemental funding such Measure C (Bicycle, Pedestrian, Urban & Rural trails, etc.) for the local match.

The parties involved include the County, Fresno Council of Governments (FCOG), California Department of Transportation (Caltrans), and Consultant(s) to be determined.

In order to satisfy the requirements of the present-day regional, state, and federal grant opportunities, there is a need for a study to identify which DUCs should be the focus of future infrastructure grant opportunities. The study would use research methods to address the effects of climate change, transportation integration, and social equity. This project will launch a comprehensive study to advance efforts toward the creation of a master project index which will provide details of the transportation needs of DUCs throughout the County. These communities will be studied regarding safety and reconstruction/rehabilitation of vehicular, bicycling, and pedestrian transportation facilities.

If the scoring committee decides not to fund this project, the County will continue to strive towards serving its DUCs; although, a study into which communities should be prioritized for optimal grant applications is needed if the County is to efficiently comply with recent State legislation regarding climate change, reducing greenhouse gases, and addressing social inequity. It is imperative that local government agencies be able to keep up with our changing world in order to serve its disadvantaged citizens more comprehensively.

The primary function of the County's Department of Public Works & Planning (PWP) is to protect and improve the investment in public infrastructure for its citizens. Currently, there are approximately 3,555 miles of roadway in unincorporated Fresno County (the most of any county in California) along with 544 bridges, providing for the safe and efficient movement of people and goods throughout the County. Many of the County's DUCs lack affordable low income housing, bicycling and pedestrian facilities, access to public transit, and adequately maintained roads. These communities lack the requisites and/or resources to qualify for public funding on their own, so the County must step in and provide the necessary improvements. Due to the limited amount of funding received from State entities, the County is unable to provide these improvements without the assistance of public grant funding.

The objective of this project is to gather empirical data to increase the County's understanding of the transportation needs of its DUCs and pursue avenues to rectify transportation infrastructure deficiencies in those communities. The data gathered may include commute patterns, accessibility, access to job centers, or Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT) and Average Daily Traffic (ADT) data to show where the communities' biggest needs lie. 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2A. Project Justification (continued)

The current methods of project identification the County employs is in need of updating to a more modern approach through advanced planning and research outlets. The funding, if awarded, will be used to hire a consultant who will have to ability to research more deeply the transportation needs of the County's DUCs.

The project is intended to foster material positive impact on DUCs within the County's jurisdiction. The information acquired by the study will provide the necessary information to identify those areas within the County most in need of transportation infrastructure improvements that will be eligible for state and federal grants, such as the Active Transportation Program (ATP), Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP), Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality program (CMAQ), Surface Transportation Block Grant program (STBG), and Highway Bridge Program (HBP) (others?). By providing these types of projects for the County's citizens, it will ensure a safer and more sustainable future for those living in DUCs.

Letters of support have been attained from various communities and are attached as Attachment F.

Should the project not be funded, the County will be limited in its ability to address the needs of its 36 DUCs. This study is one of the top priorities of the County in order to more thoroughly understand the needs of its DUCs (Attachment A). If partial funding is allowed, the County would strive to maximize the funding granted to, at the very least, complete the County's Active Transportation Plan (estimated \$200,000 need). Any project costs beyond \$200,000 would be utilized to identify, prioritize, and prepare application-ready projects for future funding opportunities. Current statistical data such as pedestrian-vehicle injuries and crashes with fatalities have been included in Attachment D.

The County identified its DUCs using current U.S. Census Tract data and recent independent studies. The DUCs are identified as those being below 80% of the statewide median household income (MHI) of \$75,235. The entire County's MHI is \$53,969, which is well below the state's MHI. For each DUC within the County's jurisdiction, the MHI fell below even the County's MHI. The average of the combined 36 DUCs within the County is \$35,862 (See Attachment G). Many of the County's DUCs are lacking a community services district. The study will identify which communities require projects that improve pedestrian and cycling facilities and road repairs. In DUCs that have no pedestrian facilities, flooding during the rainy months is an issue for children and other pedestrians because they oftentimes resort to walking in the road alongside vehicles, jeopardizing public safety. Many DUCs haven't seen any road repairs in decades due to ineligibility for certain public funding grants. The project will identify and prioritize which DUCs to focus on for future transportation related public funding grants. This will allow the County to apply for funding in the areas most in need of transportation improvements. The DUCs will benefit from the proposed project by providing safe walking paths between neighborhoods and schools, improved bicycling facilities, and smoother roadways to improve safety for both drivers and pedestrians.

The residents of the DUCs to be studied are eager to share their stories and experiences. The County's goal with the proposed study is to become a collaborator with these communities in order to meet their transportation needs in the most efficient way possible.

While the number of communities in need are overwhelming, The study will assist the County with enhancing the lines of communication with the various DUCs. Moving forward, the County will need to justify to its stakeholders why one DUC receives priority over another. With limited resources and a widespread need throughout the County, there is a need to prioritize projects absent of outside bias as to which community receives resources in order of greatest efficient use of County resources. The study will be a valuable tool in its future communication with the County's DUCs and its stakeholders.

This study an important step toward integrating the County's Trails Master Plan with FCOG's Regional Active Transportation Plan and Caltrans' long-range modal statewide plan. The study will satisfy the provisions of the Caltrans 2020-2024 Strategic Plan by focusing its efforts toward more socially and environmentally responsible methods of project identification. The project is also in line with the California Transportation Plan 2050 in that the study will help guide the County's transportation decisions and grant applications moving forward to meet our future multi modal mobility needs and reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

To satisfy the requirements of all the present-day regional, state, and federal grant opportunities, there is a need for such a study to identify which communities should be the focus of future grant opportunities. The study would use research methods which address the effects of climate change, transportation integration, and social equity. The outcome of the study should result in stronger partnerships with the County's stakeholders.

The west side of Fresno County contains some of the of the most pollution-burdened census tracts in the state (see Attachment E). These neighborhoods rank high for fine particulate matter in the air, pesticide exposure and contaminated drinking water, as well as high rates of poverty, unemployment, asthma, low birth weight and cardiovascular disease.

Fresno County has the most road miles of any other county in California (See Attachment H). Most of the gas tax, however is distributed based on an area's population and not road miles. As a result, there isn't enough funding to make the necessary improvements in each community with gas tax funding alone. The deferred costs of road and sidewalk maintenance are estimated at approximately \$1 billion.

The data provided on Attachment I shows the VMT conditions for the 36 DUCs in Fresno County. The counts reflect a high exiting VMT due to a lack of multi-modal options as residents of the DUCs rely solely on individual vehicles to get around. The study will help identify how the communities would benefit most from transportation infrastructure improvements which will help lower VMTs, reduce PM 2.5 contaminants and GHG emissions, and target which communities would have the most success with future grant opportunities.

In keeping with California's planning priorities, the study will examine current data and emerging data trends to consider future issues and challenges for the County's DUCs. Similar to a general plan, the study will provide a basis of the County to make decisions regarding where infrastructure improvements are the most needed and which will minimize ongoing costs to taxpayers.

The study will discuss how the prioritized infrastructure improvements in the County's DUCs will assist in achieving California's Climate Action Plan for Transportation Infrastructure (CAPTI). The projects resulting from the County's study will not only combat and adapt to climate change by researching ways to target GHG emissions among the County's transportation facilities, but also strive to support public health, safety, and social equity.

In order to comply with the Goals and Best Practices cited in the 2017 RTP Guidelines, the study will identify projects which increase physical activity and active transportation, reduce collision injuries and fatalities, minimize air pollution, and contribute to the overall health and well-being of residents in the County's DUCs.

The study will engage divisions within PWP, such as the Community Development Division, the Development Services Division, the Road Maintenance and Operations Division. Outside of PWP, the County's Department of Public Health will be engaged to assist in health data acquired from the various DUCs. The study will also engage FCOG's resources and data from the U.S. Census Bureau to pinpoint exactly which communities are most in need of improvements. Other agencies which may be involved in the study include the San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District and the Fresno County Housing Authority.

The County believes that also involving any of the DUCs' community services districts, as well as their residents, will lead to a better process, greater community support, and more ideas on the table. The study will result in a better understanding of these communities with a participatory process which will foster an overall more effective effort to take advantage of all the possible advantages brought by infrastructure improvements.

The proposed study will address sustainability issues by identifying the DUCs most in need of reliable and efficient mobility of people, goods, and services, while meeting the State's GHG emission reduction goals. Preservation of the County's transportation systems is vital to the long-term success of its transportation planning goals by identifying projects which will enhance the quality of life and environmental health of the DUC residents. By pinpointing which areas need an increase in pedestrian and bicycle facilities, safer intersections, and road repairs, the study will not only improve the mobility of all DUC residents, but enhance safety and security of the transportation system for motorized and active transportation users. The study will seek to promote the best use of technology and innovative designs to improve the performance and social equity of our transportation system and provide sustainable transportation options. The resulting projects will support the economic vitality of the DUCs identified for improvements by easing obstacles to multi-modal travel within the communities to various local destinations such as businesses, schools, community centers, and services. The improvements to DUC transportation systems will decrease exposure to local pollution sources, reduce serious injuries and fatalities, and promote physical activity, thereby enhancing health, longevity, and quality of life. Transportation solutions that focus on and prioritize the needs of the County's DUCs will mitigate the challenges of social equity by encouraging residents to participate in the transportation decision-making process.

Introduction

The County of Fresno (County) has identified the need for a more comprehensive plan to select local communities in which to focus efforts on infrastructure project identification and implementation. The projects that are generated by this study will be considered for selection for state and federal grants such as the Active Transportation Program (ATP), Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality program (CMAQ), Surface Transportation Block Grant program (STBG), and others.

The funding, if awarded, will be used to hire a consultant who will be tasked with investigating and analyzing the needs of the County's Disadvantaged Unincorporated Communities (DUCs) and provide the necessary information to identify those areas within the County most in need of infrastructure improvements. The County will make available supplemental funding such Measure C (Bicycle, Pedestrian, Urban & Rural trails, etc.) for the local match.

Project Stakeholders

The Project Stakeholders include, but are not limited to, the County's Department of Public Health (FCDPH), Fresno Council of Governments (FCOG), San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District (SJVAPCD), the Fresno County Housing Authority (FCHA), California Department of Transportation (Caltrans), and Consultant(s) to be determined.

FCDPH will be engaged to assist in health data acquired from the various DUCs. The study will also engage FCOG's resources and data from the U.S. Census Bureau to pinpoint exactly which communities are most in need of improvements. SJVPCD will be a valuable resource of data which would be integrated into the study to determine the best methods of tackling air quality issues in the County. FCHA will play an integral part in providing statistics and data for the County's DUCs which will help determine which areas would most benefit from transportation improvements that may lead to greater availability of low-income housing. Caltrans may be asked to assist with infrastructure improvements which may affect state highway facilities, as well as routine funding authorizations for the grant and the various projects which may be generated from the study. Additionally, many of the County's DUCs have community services districts in place, and partnership with those agencies will be vital to the outcome of the study.

Overall Project Objectives

Sustainability

The proposed study will address sustainability issues by identifying the DUCs most in need of reliable and efficient mobility of people, goods, and services, while meeting the State's GHG emission reduction goals.

Preservation

Preservation of the County's transportation systems is vital to the long-term success of its transportation planning goals identifying projects which will enhance the quality of life and environmental health of the County's DUCs.

Accessibility

The study will examine potential methods to increase accessibility within the County's transportation infrastructure and ways to improve mobility of people in the County's DUCs, inclusive of those with disabilities and/or socio-economic disadvantage.

Safety

The safety and security of its citizens are a priority for the County. The study will aim to increase the safety and security of its DUCs' transportation system for motorized and active transportation users.

Innovation

A valuable portion of the study would be the investigation of potential technology and innovative designs which may improve the performance and social equity of the County's transportation system, as well as provide sustainable transportation options.

Economy

The projects generated from the proposed study would focus on improving transportation efficiency among the County's DUCs, which would increase the economic vitality and equity of these communities by offering residents outlets to reduce barriers to employment through transportation infrastructure improvements.

Health

The proposed study will focus on recommending projects that decrease exposure to local pollution sources, reduce serious injuries and fatalities on the transportation system, and promote physical activity across the lifespan, inclusive of those with disabilities, especially through transportation means.

Social Equity

The projects that are recommended by the proposed study will promote transportation solutions that focus on and prioritize the needs of disadvantaged communities most affected by poverty, air pollution and climate change. The projects will focus on solutions that integrate community values with transportation safety and performance while encouraging meaningful public involvement in the transportation decision making process. Transportation solutions that focus on and prioritize the needs of the County's DUCs will mitigate the challenges of social equity by encouraging residents to participate in the transportation decision-making process.
