FOR THE FRESNO COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS
MEAUSRE CYCLE TRANSIT ORIENTED DEVELOPMENT
PROGRAM (TOD) CYCLE 13

WHEREAS, the Fresno Council of Governments (Fresno COG) Measure C Transit Oriented Development Program Cycle 13 grant applications are due March 4, 2025; and

WHEREAS, procedures established by Fresno COG require the grantee's governing body to certify by resolution the approval of project application(s); and

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works and Planning (Department) intends to submit an application to Fresno COG for funding on March 4, 2025; and

WHEREAS, this project would build sidewalks and bike lanes on a half-mile County-maintained section of the street that has none, but which is adjacent to City-maintained segments which have both. Therefore, this project would fill a gap in safety infrastructure. There are also six transit stops within this stretch, some of which are in unsafe locations and must be made ADA compliant; and

WHEREAS, the Pedestrian/Bike Improvements on Chestnut Avenue from Shields Avenue to Clinton Avenue proposed by the Department meets the program policies and guidelines as stated by the Measure C Transit-Oriented Infrastructure for Infill Development as created in the 2006 Measure C Extension Plan In support of community-based transit projects; and

WHEREAS, the Department desires to ensure that its projects are developed through an inclusive planning process with broad private-public partnerships and outreach; improve the range of transportation choices by supporting transit facilities and improving links between facilities and activity nodes; and support well-designed, high-density housing and mixed uses near transit; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Fresno County Board of Supervisors hereby agrees to ensure that all project delivery deadlines for all project phases will be met or exceeded.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Fresno County Board of Supervisors does direct its management, Planning and Finance staffs to ensure all projects are carried out in a timely manner and at the directive of the Board of Supervisors.
