Executive Summary

1. Introduction

CARES Act, CDBG-CV & ESG-CV Substantial Amendment

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) was passed to address issues related to the COVID-19 pandemic, with the intent to prevent and respond to the spread of the coronavirus. This substantial amendment identifies the planned use of the supplemental CARES Act funding for the Community Development Block Grant program (CDBG-CV funds) and Emergency Solutions Grant program (ESG-CV funds).

4. Summary of Citizen Participation Process and consultation process

CARES Act, CDBG-CV & ESG-CV Substantial Amendment

The County consulted with the six cities participating in its Urban County CDBG program, to identify projects to be funded with CDBG-CV funds. The County also consulted with the Fresno-Madera Continuum of Care for its planned uses of ESG-CV funds.

The substantial amendment was also reviewed by the County's Housing and Community Development Citizens Advisory Committee.

The Board of Supervisors held a noticed public hearing on the adoption of the substantial amendment, during which public comment on the substantial amendment was accepted.

A second substantial amendment was prepared, updating planned uses of CDBG-CV funds and identifying planned uses of ESG-CV funds. The second substantial amendment was also reviewed by the County's Housing and Community Development Citizens Advisory Committee, and considered by the Board of Supervisors, which held a noticed public hearing on the adoption of the substantial amendment, during which public comment on the substantial amendment was accepted.

Pursuant to HUD-approved waivers of standard CDBG requirements, the public comment period and public notice of the Board of Supervisors' hearing were reduced to five days.

The substantial amendment was made available for public review and comment to the general public on the County's website at www.fresncountyca.gov/grants.

5. Summary of public comments

CARES Act, CDBG-CV & ESG-CV Substantial Amendment

Feedback from the public at public meetings and hearings are incorporated into the Action Plan. The County will make every effort to address all written comments regarding its substantial amendment prior to submittal to HUD.

The County will make every effort to address all written comments regarding the published Action Plan.

7. Summary

CARES Act, CDBG-CV & ESG-CV Substantial Amendment

The County identified projects to receive CDBG-CV funding. Although some of the projects identified are similar to existing projects in the Action Plan, for clarity, the substantial amendment includes new CDBG-CV priority needs, goals and projects.

The County has identified ESG-eligible activities to fund based on the current status of COVID-19, as well as the potential status of homeless individuals after the COVID-19 pandemic. Together with the Fresno-Madera Continuum of Care, the County will provide homeless individuals and families with the support and assistance necessary to ensure a successful transition to permanent housing.

CARES Act, CDBG-CV & ESG-CV Substantial Amendment

The County consulted with the Fresno-Madera Continuum of Care on its funding priorities and was open to any feedback and suggestions. With the continued collaboration between the County and the Fresno-Madera Continuum of Care, services can be tailored to meet the needs of the community.

On May 20, 2020, the Board-appointed Housing and Community Development Citizens Advisory Committee met to review the substantial amendment. The Citizens Advisory Committee recommended approval of the substantial amendment.

On May 26, 2020, the Fresno County Board of Supervisors held a noticed public hearing to accept public comment and approve the substantial amendment. See the Appendix for public notice, public comments received and response to the comments.

Pursuant to HUD-approved waivers of standard CDBG requirements, the public comment period and public notice of the Board of Supervisors' hearing were reduced to five days.

The substantial amendment was made available for public review and comment to the general public on the County's website at www.fresncountyca.gov/grants.

Addressing the emergency shelter and transitional housing needs of homeless persons

CARES Act, CDBG-CV & ESG-CV Substantial Amendment

The County will provide shelter due to the state and local shelter in place order to prevent the spread of COVID-19 to homeless persons in Selma and the surrounding unincorporated areas, with the potential to serve homeless persons from other cities including Fowler, Kingsburg, and Reedley. The County would contract with the Super 8 Hotel in Selma to provide rooms, including handicapped accessible rooms if needed.

The addition of ESG-CV funds will allow the County to provide temporary housing to more individuals in the County. While emergency shelter will assist in preventing the spread of COVID-19, it will also allow homeless service providers to have regular contact with individuals that may otherwise be difficult to locate throughout the County.

Helping homeless persons (especially chronically homeless individuals and families, families with children, veterans and their families, and unaccompanied youth) make the transition to permanent housing and independent living, including shortening the period of time that individuals and families experience homelessness, facilitating access for homeless individuals and families to affordable housing units, and preventing individuals and families who were recently homeless from becoming homeless again

CARES Act, CDBG-CV & ESG-CV Substantial Amendment

The County intends to seek permanent housing for the homeless persons receiving temporary shelter under the CDBG-CV program, using other services and/or funding sources.

With ESG-CV funds, rapid rehousing and homelessness prevention will be utilized to house those that are homeless as well as those that are at-risk of becoming homeless. The County will continue to follow the Housing First model to ensure that individuals assisted with ESG-CV funds are homeless the least amount of time possible and are able to be housed as quickly as possible.

11.
