Overlapping jurisdictions are required to coordinate and develop a single Regionally Coordinated Homelessness Action Plan and apply together.



Jurisdictions must engage key stakeholders during the development of the Action Plan.



Become part of a regional Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) committing to participate in and comply with the Local Homelessness Action Plan.

Local Homelessness Action Plan Overview

Roles and Responsibilities

- **Outreach and Site Coordination**
- **Land Use and Development**
- **Development of Shelter, Interim, and Permanent Housing Options**
- **Coordination of and Connection to Service Delivery**

System Performance Measures:

- 1a: Number of people accessing services who are experiencing homelessness: **8,029**
- 1b: Number of people experiencing unsheltered homelessness on a single night: **2,338**
- 2: Number of people accessing services who are experiencing homelessness for the first time: **4,481**
- 3: Number of people exiting homelessness into permanent housing: **1,590**
- 4: Average length of time that people experienced homelessness while accessing services: **121 days**
- 5: Percent of people who return to homelessness within 6 months of exiting homelessness response system to permanent housing: **10%**
- 6: Number of people with successful placements from street outreach projects: **385**

Improvement Plan:

- Equity Improvement Plan

 - Jail
 - Prison
 - Hospitals*
- Plan to Utilize Local, State, and Federal Funds to End Homelessness
 - EX: NPLH, HHAP, HOME, HUD ESG, HDAP, CalWorks, etc.*

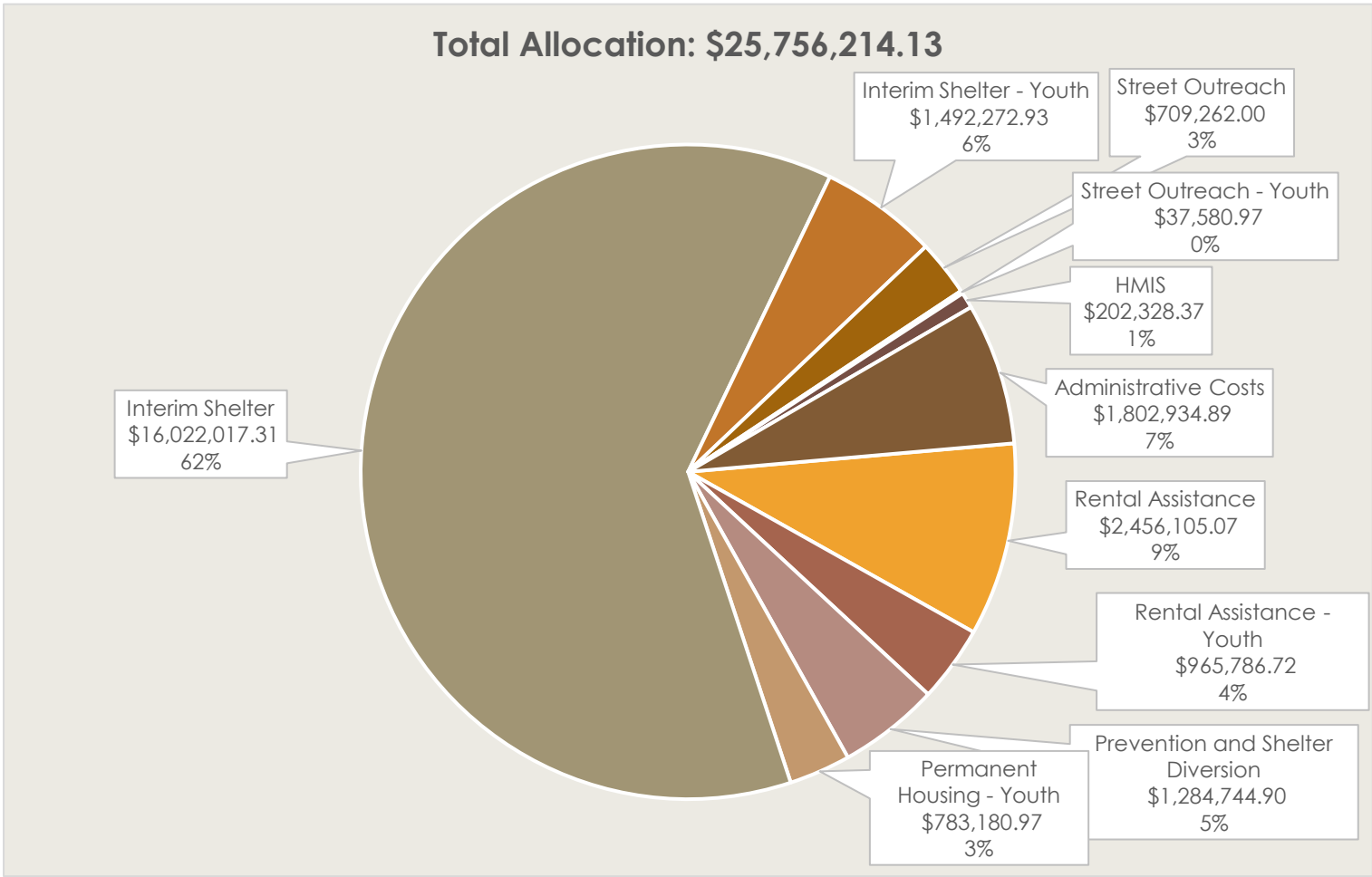
HHAP-5 Funding Overview

Fresno Madera Continuum of Care Service Area combined allocation: **\$25.7M**

- County of Fresno: \$5.2 million
- FMCoC: \$6.5 million
- City of Fresno: \$13 million
- County of Madera: \$1 million

Funding Requirements

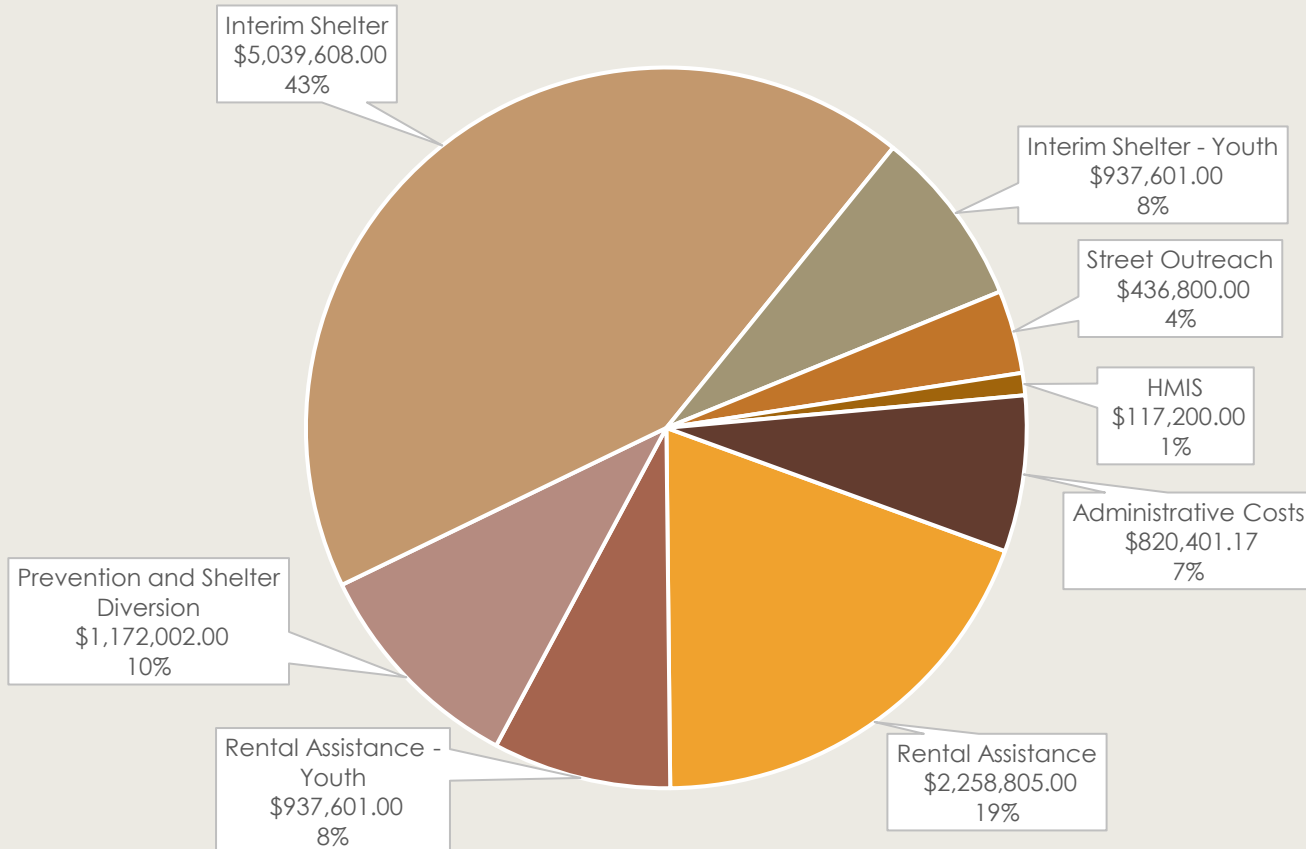
- Minimum of 10% (\$2.6 million) must go to youth services
- Max of 7% (\$1.8 million) may go to admin costs
- Supplemental funding will be available later in 2024 (\$7.3 million or 28%)



HHAP-5 Cross-Jurisdictional Funding Plan

HHAP-5 County of Fresno & FMCoC Funding Plan

Total Allocation: \$11,720,018.17



Youth Bridge Housing:

Sanctuary Transition Shelter:

- 12-bed bridge emergency shelter for youth (ages of 18 and 24) experiencing homelessness.
- Program ensures that youth who are unsheltered and not appropriate for the adult triage center have an emergency bed available.
- Maximum length of stay is 6 months.





Special Population - Triage Center Emergency Shelter Services:

Naomi's House:

- 40-bed emergency shelter for women experiencing homelessness.
- Program provides intensive case management services that focus on helping participants develop a housing plan and overcome barriers to attaining permanent housing.
- Maximum length of stay is 90 days.



Master Leased Housing & Rapid Rehousing:

Monte Vista:

- 42 units available to families with children.
- Stay of approximately 12 months with potential additional 12 months of assistance in permanent residence.
- Onsite rapid rehousing case management services.

Triage Center Emergency Shelter Services

The Welcome Center:

- 30 emergency shelter beds for individuals and families experiencing homelessness.
- Wraparound services to attain permanent housing
- Maximum length of stay will be 90 days.



Outreach Services

Kingsview PATH Program:

- Program aimed at “meeting people where they are” and collaborating with other agencies across the system of care.
- Assist persons served in achieving their personal recovery and wellness goals.
- Services incorporate safety, emergency, and crisis procedures in the field.
- Linkage services, supportive housing services, and mobile outreach services.



Next Steps



A single application on behalf of the jurisdictions will be submitted to the State by March 29, 2024.



Upon approval of the application, the state will issue an agreement for the funding.



HHAP-5 agreements will be awarded; Agreements will be brought to your Board in 2024.



The County and its regional partners will convene to continue our work to end homelessness.
