



Q3 How are you taking this survey?







Q7 Has anyone in your family had trouble accessing services, resources, or safety net programs?









Q17 What type of help does your community need to make housing more affordable?














Q42 Who experienced homelessness?





Q51 What is your ethnicity?




Q52 What is the highest level of education you have completed?

Q22 Thinking about the Fresno/Clovis Metro Area... what is needed to help or prevent people from experiencing homelessness?





Q32 What types of public services are needed in rural communities outside of the Fresno/Clovis Metro Area?








Q33 Which three activities is it most critical for the County to fund in rural communities that do not have other/sufficient funding sources?
















