RESOLUTION NO. 20-060

Resolution Establishing Infrastructure Facility Fee to Provide for Millerton New Town Infrastructure
Facilities for Tract No. 4934

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Fresno, on December 19, 2000, adopted the Millerton New Town Infrastructure Plan and Implementation Procedures (Infrastructure Plan) creating and establishing the authority for imposing and charging a fee for the development of public sewer and water facilities identified in Exhibit A to this resolution for projects within the Millerton Specific Plan area (Facility Fee); and

WHEREAS, notice of the public meeting and a general explanation of the matter to be considered was published according to Government Code Section 66018; and,

WHEREAS, notice of the public meeting and a general explanation of the matter to be considered was mailed at least 14 days prior to the meeting to any interested party who had filed a written request for mailed notice of the meeting on new or increased fees or service charges, as required by Government Code Section 66019; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to public notice, a hearing was held as part of a regularly scheduled meeting at which oral or written presentations could be made; and,

WHEREAS, application has been made for approval of the Final Map for Tract No. 4934; and,

WHEREAS, on September 7, 2000 the Fresno County Planning Commission approved Vesting Tentative Subdivision Map No. 4934, Classified Conditional Use Permit No. 2935, Site Plan Review No. 7044, and Mitigation Measures adopted and/or approved through the associated Initial Study subject to certain conditions; and,

WHEREAS, a detailed study of the cost of construction of those sewer and water facilities (Improvements) identified in the Infrastructure Plan was prepared for and reviewed by the Department of

1 Public Works and Planning entitled "MILLERTON NEW TOWN INFRASTRUCTURE PLAN FACILITY
2 FEES AND SPECIFIC PLAN DEVELOPMENT FEES" dated June 2008, and is on file with the
3 Department of Public Works and Planning, Development Services and Capital Projects Division (Fee
4 Study); and,

5 WHEREAS, said Infrastructure Plan sets forth the relationship between the proposed
6 development and the needed facilities and said detailed study estimated the cost of those
7 improvements; and

8 WHEREAS, these studies were made available for public inspection and review for at least 10
9 days prior to this public hearing, as required by Government Code section 66019; and,

10 WHEREAS, said Infrastructure Plan requires the payment of the Facility Fee to fund the
11 construction of Improvements within the Infrastructure Plan area; and,

12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of County of Fresno that:

13 1. Findings.

14 The Board makes the following findings:

- 15 A. All of the recitals stated above are true and correct. The purpose of the Facility Fee is to
16 finance public facility improvements to mitigate the impact caused by development of
17 Tract No. 4934. Such improvements include the construction of sewer and water facilities
18 within the Millerton Specific Plan area. (Gov. Code section 66001, subd. (a)(1).)
- 19 B. The fees collected pursuant to this resolution shall be used to finance the cost of
20 Improvements identified in Exhibit A attached to this resolution. (Gov. Code section
21 66001, subd. (a)(2).)
- 22 C. After considering the Infrastructure Plan and the Fee Study, and the testimony received
23 at this public hearing, the Board of Supervisors approves and adopts the Fee Study and
24 incorporates it into this resolution, and further finds that the development of Tract No.
25 4934 will generate additional demands on facilities.
- 26 D. As development occurs throughout the Millerton Specific Plan area, there will be a need
27 for expanded, improved, and newly constructed Improvements.
- 28 E. The Infrastructure Plan, Fee Study, and testimony establish:

- 1 1. That there is a reasonable relationship between the fee's use, namely, expanded,
2 improved, or newly constructed Improvements as described above, and the type
3 of development for which the fee is charged, which is residential development
4 associated with Tract No. 4934, as described above (Gov. Code section 66001,
5 subd. (a)(3));
- 6 2. That there is a reasonable relationship between the need for the Improvements as
7 designated in Exhibit A and the impacts of the development of Tract No. 4934 as
8 identified in the Infrastructure Plan and Fee Study, for which the corresponding
9 fee is charged (Gov. Code section 66001, subd. (a)(4)); and,
- 10 3. There is a reasonable relationship between the amount of the fee and the cost of
11 the Improvements or portion of the Improvements attributable to the development
12 of Tract No. 4934 on which the fee is to be imposed (Gov. Code section 66001,
13 subd. (b)).

14 2. Fee Imposed.

15 An Infrastructure Plan Facility Fee, in the amount stated in Section 3, shall be charged and paid
16 before the issuance of a building permit for each residential lot developed in Tract No. 4934; provided,
17 however, that the developer may enter into a written agreement with the County to pay the fee no earlier
18 than concurrently with the recordation of a final map for property within the Infrastructure Plan area.

19 3. Amount of Infrastructure Facility Fee.

- 20 A. The fee for each single-family lot in Tract No. 4934 shall be \$18,344.67.
- 21 B. The amount of the fee shall be adjusted on January 15 annually by a percentage equal to
22 the change in the Engineering News Record Construction Cost Index for 20-Cities for the
23 preceding year as published in the Fourth Quarterly Cost Issue in the preceding
24 December.

25 4. Payment of Other Fees Required.

- 26 A. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Resolution, development of Tract No. 4934
27 within the Infrastructure Plan area is responsible for the payment of all other applicable
28 fees adopted by the County.

1 B. Nothing in this Resolution affects the obligation of any person to pay Area of Benefit fees
2 established pursuant to Fresno County Ordinance Code so long as this fee shall not
3 result in a duplicate fee for any development or portion thereof included in an Area of
4 Benefit.

5 5. Use of Fee Revenues.

6 A. The revenues collected by payment of the Facility Fee shall be placed in the Millerton
7 New Town Infrastructure Plan Facility Fee accounts and such revenues, plus any interest
8 earnings on each account, shall be used for the following purposes:

- 9 1. To pay for design and construction of designated Improvements; and
- 10 2. To reimburse developers who have designed and constructed designated
11 Infrastructure Facilities which are oversized with supplemental size, length, or
12 capacity; and
- 13 3. To pay for and/or reimburse costs of program development and ongoing
14 administration of the Infrastructure Facility Plan Funds.

15 6. Expenditure of the Fees.

16 A. Fees in the Millerton New Town Infrastructure Plan Facility accounts shall be expended
17 only for those facilities listed in Exhibit A and only for the purpose for which the fee was
18 collected.

19 B. Proceeds of the Facility Fees shall not be used to pay for existing deficiencies of any
20 public facilities.

21 7. Administrative Regulations.

22 The Director of the Department of Public Works and Planning shall develop procedures for the
23 effective implementation and administration of the Millerton New Town Infrastructure Plan Facility Fee
24 and to annually review and update the Fee Schedule.


