ATTACHMENT C

CDBG-CV PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

CDBG-CV: Emergency Shelter

Provides funds for temporary shelter to homeless persons in a contracted hotel in the City of Selma, and wrap-around services provided by a non-profit agency in the City of Selma. Funding for the emergency shelter will be provided from the County's unincorporated area portion of CDBG-CV funds, and from a portion of the City of Reedley's allocation of CDBG-CV funds.

CDBG-CV: Fire Protection Equipment

Provides funds for COVID-19 related personal protective equipment and other supplies for agencies providing fire protection services to City of Mendota and eligible unincorporated areas.

CDBG-CV: Other Public Services

Provides funds for COVID-19 related public service activities in the six participating cities (Fowler, Kerman, Kingsburg, Mendota, Reedley, and Selma) and the unincorporated area. Includes the provision of meals to seniors and/or disabled residents, funding to food banks, short-term financial assistance to qualified low-income residents for internet connectivity. Also includes mobile outreach services, providing referrals and linkage to housing assistance, healthcare, and other services providers through the County's Department of Behavioral Health and funding to the County's Department of Public Health for the procurement and distribution of multi-lingual multimedia health education information designed to reduce the spread of infectious disease.
