I write you today to express my deep concerns with the recent recommendation by the Social Services Agency to discontinue the Uplift Family Services Wraparound contract in FY 2018.

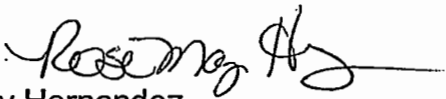
As a resident of this county, I am disappointed by this decision. The decision is not good for children, is not good for families, and is not good for our community. I am perplexed that it appears that the County did not consider performance outcomes – how well families do in and after leaving the program - in the evaluation of proposals. As a taxpayer in this County, I expect that the County will always consider performance outcomes in its contracting for services. To do otherwise does not make the best use of public funds.

This ultimately penalizes an agency that has consistently provided outstanding services and has achieved great outcomes for children and families.

I urge you to right this wrong by rejecting this proposed award and award half of the proposed contract to Uplift Family Services to minimize the disruption of services to some of the county's most vulnerable population.

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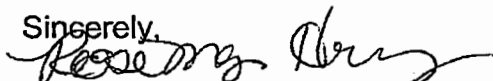

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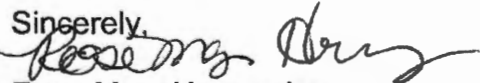
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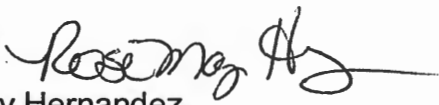
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
