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5	IN THE MATTER OF THE 2023 FEBRUARY WINTER STORMS RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING THE EXISTENCE OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY DUE TO FEBRUARY		
6	IN FRESNO COUNTY WINTER STORMS		
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8	WHEREAS, the California Emergency Services Act (Government Code section 8630, et.		
9	seq.) establishes procedures for proclaiming emergencies and for responding promptly to the		
10	needs that arise during emergencies; and		
11	WHEREAS, section 2.44.060.A. of the Fresno County Code and Section 8630 of the		
12	Government Code empower the Emergency Services Director or his designee, or the Board of		
13	Supervisors if in session, to proclaim the existence of a local emergency when the County is		
14	affected by or likely to be affected by a public calamity; and,		
15	WHEREAS, the County Administrative Officer, acting in his capacity as the Emergency		
16	Services Director of the County of Fresno, does hereby find that conditions of extreme peril to		
17	public safety and public health have arisen within Fresno County as a result of extreme storm		
18	events that began on February 23, 2023 caused overwhelming weather conditions; and		
19	WHEREAS, record amounts of snow and rain have caused damages to Fresno County		
20	roads and infrastructure and have forced residents to shelter-in-place in their homes for long		
21	periods of times, sometimes requiring evacuation by the Sheriff's Department; and		
22	WHEREAS, shelters have been opened in the City of Reedley, the community of Prather,		
23	and the city of Sanger, where the nearby communities are compromised due to the long-term		
24	power outages were affecting 1,570 homes in Fresno County; and		
25	WHEREAS, ingress and egress for residents in eastern Fresno County are compromised		
26	due to closed highways and County roads as a result of heavy snow, flooding, and damaged roads		
27	and drainage systems; and		
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1 WHEREAS, forecasted atmospheric river systems continue to threaten additional 2 infrastructure; and 3 WHEREAS, uncontrolled snow-melt and run-off from historic snow amounts will overwhelm 4 water drainage systems and established watersheds, which will lead to flash flooding, rockfall, 5 mudslides, debris flows, and damages to roadways; and 6 WHEREAS, local resources are inadequate to cope with the effects of said emergency and 7 the combined forces of other political subdivisions of the State are required to assist the County to 8 combat the effects of said emergency; and 9 WHEREAS, on March 1, 2023, the Governor of California proclaimed a State of Emergency 10 to exist throughout California due to severe winter storms related to damaging winds and historic 11 precipitation, including snowfall in areas unaccustomed to snow; and 12 WHEREAS, the County of Fresno Emergency Services Director proclaimed a local 13 emergency on March 2, 2023; and 14 WHEREAS, on March 7, 2023, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Fresno ratified the proclamation by the Emergency Services Director and adopted a resolution proclaiming the 15 local emergency status; and 16 17 WHEREAS, on April 14, 2023, the County of Fresno was added to the list of Counties 18 included in the Presidential Emergency Declaration; and 19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors that a Local 20 Emergency exists throughout Fresno County and that said Local Emergency shall be deemed to 21 continue to exist until its termination is proclaimed by the Board of Supervisors; and 22 IT IS FURTHER PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that during the existence of said local 23 emergency, the powers, functions, and duties for the emergency organization of this County shall 24 be those prescribed by state law, ordinances and resolutions of this County, and by the Fresno County Operational Area Master Emergency Services Plan, as approved by the Board of 25 26 Supervisors; and 27 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a copy of this Resolution be forwarded to the State 28 Director of the Office of Emergency Services.
