Participating Cities Public Services: Provides funds for public service activities in the six participating cities (Fowler, Kerman, Kingsburg, Mendota, Reedley, and Selma), which may include emergency assistance grants, food assistance and/or delivery, health services, education and outreach, broadband/internet connectivity, homeless activities, and business loans or grants.

Emergency Homeless Shelter: Provides funds for temporary shelter to homeless persons in a contracted hotel in the City of Selma, including temporary trailers for the isolation of homeless persons testing positive for coronavirus, and wrap-around services provided by a non-profit agency in the City of Selma.

Unincorporated Area Public Services: Provides funds for public service activities in the unincorporated area, which may include emergency assistance grants, food assistance and/or delivery, health services, education and outreach, broadband/internet connectivity, homeless activities, and business loans or grants.

Unincorporated Area/City Fire Protection Equipment: Provides funds for personal protective equipment and other supplies for agencies providing fire protection services to the eligible cities or unincorporated areas.

ATTACHMENT C

EMERGENCY HOMELESS SHELTER PROJECT

Project Description:

Provide shelter due to the state and local shelter in place order to prevent the spread of COVID-19 to homeless persons in Selma and the surrounding unincorporated areas, with the potential to serve homeless persons from other cities including Fowler, Kingsburg, and Reedley. The County would contract with the Super 8 Hotel in Selma to provide rooms, including handicapped accessible rooms if needed.

Services to be provided include shelter in the form of a hotel room with beds and showers. The County will contract with Selma Community Outreach Ministries to provide wrap-around services, including sanitation, janitorial, feeding, and security services. Up to two temporary trailers may be installed in the parking lot of the hotel to assist with the quarantine of homeless individuals that have tested positive for COVID-19. These trailers would connect to city services.

Project Funding:

The project will be fully funded using CDBG-CV funds in the amount of \$400,000. The project cost includes hotel rooms, temporary trailers, shelter monitors, a cook and security personnel. Food costs include food supplies, utensils, and paper products. Staff mileage and required insurances are included as well as administrative cost for Selma Community Outreach Ministries.

Project Duration:

Project funding is sufficient to provide services for up to six months.

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
