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8 9	WHEREAS as a condition of approval of Parcel Map Waiver No. 93-18 (Map 93-18), the
10	Fresho County Board of Supervisors (Board) required the formation of a zone within County
11	Service Area (CSA) 35 to fund the maintenance of roads serving properties within Parcel Map Waiver 93-18; and
12	WHEREAS Zone AI of CSA 35 (CSA 35-AI), also known as Round Mountain Estates,
13	located approximately 13 miles northeast of the City of Sanger, west of Watts Valley Road in the
14	County of Fresno, more particularly described in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated
15	herein by reference, was formed on June 27, 1995, for the maintenance of roads benefiting
16	parcels within Map 93-18; and
17	WHEREAS the roads constructed to serve properties within CSA 35-AI, bearing the
18	name Bull Run Lane, and Williamsburg Lane, are private roads dedicated for public use; and
19	WHEREAS property owners within CSA 35-AI have installed gates at the entrance to Bull
20	Run Lane and Williamsburg Lane to limit public access; and
21	WHEREAS roads dedicated for public use cannot be gated; and
22	WHEREAS property owners within CSA 35-AI, through Round Mountain Estates
23	Homeowners Association (RMEHOA), desires to keep the gates and proposes that RMEHOA
24	provide road maintenance for Bull Run Lane and Williamsburg Lane and that CSA 35-AI be
25	dissolved; and
26	WHEREAS the RMEHOA has made amendments, acceptable to the Director (Director) of
27	the Department of Public Works and Planning (Department), to their governing documents to
28	officially assume road maintenance responsibilities upon dissolution of CSA 35-AI; and

WHEREAS property owner petitions, representing more than 10 percent of the registered voters residing within CSA 35-AI, and over 50 percent of owners of property within CSA 35-AI, were submitted to the Resources Division of the Department requesting dissolution of CSA 35-AI, AI; and

WHEREAS pursuant to Title 3, Division 2, Part 2, Chapter 2.5, Article 8 of the California Government Code (CSA Zone Law), zones within a CSA may dissolved; and

WHEREAS in accordance with Section 25217.1 of the CSA Zone Law, the Board will hold a public hearing to hear and consider protests to the dissolution of CSA 35-AI, and, at the close of that hearing, determine if a majority protest to the dissolution of CSA 35-AI exists; and

WHEREAS the procedure for determining a majority protest, pursuant to Section 25721.1 of the CSA Zone Law, is based on the number of registered voters residing in the zone being considered; and

WHEREAS a voter count provided by the Fresno County Clerk/Registrar of Voters, a certificate of which is on file with the Clerk to the Board, shows that there are less than twelve (12) registered voters residing in CSA 35-AI which, pursuant to Government Code Section 25210.2, (e), is defined as uninhabited territory; and

WHEREAS pursuant to Section 25721.1, (2), of the CSA Zone Law, if the Board determines that more than 50 percent of the property owners who own more than 50 percent of the assessed value of all taxable property in the proposed zone have filed written objections to the formation, then the board shall determine that a majority protest exists and terminate the proceedings; and

WHEREAS before adopting this Resolution, the Board fairly considered all testimony and documentary evidence, and gave all persons a full and fair opportunity to be heard with respect to any matter relating to the subject of this Resolution, both in favor and against it, and any matter relevant to these proceedings, all of which was done in the interest of the public, and the Board is fully informed of all matters referred to in this Resolution, and that, it is the intention of the Board to consider the dissolution of CSA 35-AI and set the date, time, and location of a public protest hearing.

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board that each of the foregoing recitals is true and correct.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board declares its intention to consider dissolving CSA-AI and terminating assessments, currently being collected for maintenance of approximately 1.35 miles of Bull Run Lane and Williamsburg Lane, upon real property within CSA 35-AI beginning in the Fiscal Year 2025-26.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board shall conduct a public protest hearing at 9:30 A.M. (or as soon thereafter as circumstances permit) on August 20, 2024, in the meeting chambers of the County of Fresno Board of Supervisors, Hall of Records, 2281 Tulare Street, Third Floor, Fresno, California 93721, concerning the proposed dissolution of CSA 35-AI.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board, pursuant to Section 25217(d) of the Government Code, directs the Clerk to the Board to provide a notice that: States that the proposal to dissolve CSA 35-AI is made pursuant to CSA Zone Law; Sets forth a description of the boundaries of the territory included in CSA 35-AI; States the reasons for dissolution; States the different authorized services, different levels of service, different authorized facilities, or additional revenues that are provided by CSA 35-AI; Sets forth the methods by which those authorized services, levels of service, or authorized facilities will be continued to be performed and financed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the notice provided pursuant to Section 25217(d) of the Government Code, shall be, at least twenty (20) days prior to the public hearing, published one time in a newspaper of general circulation published in the County, mailed to all owners of property within CSA 35-AI, mailed to each city and special district that contains, or whose sphere of influence contains CSA 35-AI, and posted in at least three public places within CSA 35-AI.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any registered voter residing within CSA 35-AI or owner of property within CSA 35-AI may file a written protest against the dissolution with the Clerk to the Board at or before the time set for the public protest hearing. Each protest must contain a description of the property in which the signer is interested, sufficient to identify the property. Under this written protest proceeding, if at the conclusion of the public hearing, the

1 Board determines that more than 50 percent of the property owners who own more than 50 2 percent of the assessed value of all taxable property in the zone have filed written objections to 3 the formation, then the Board shall determine that a majority protest exists and terminate the proceedings. 4

5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that other interested parties may protest orally or in writing 6 regarding the dissolution of CSA 35-AI. Any protests pertaining to the regularity or sufficiency of 7 the proceeding must be in writing, clearly setting forth the irregularities and defects to which 8 objection is made.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all written protests must be filed with the Clerk to the 9 10 Board at or before the time fixed for the public protest hearing. Written protests from registered voters, property owners, taxpayers or other interested parties may be withdrawn in writing at any 11 12 time prior to conclusion of the hearing.

13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if a majority protest is made, or if a majority of written 14 protests are received, the dissolution of CSA 35-AI shall be abandoned, each of the gates 15 blocking public entrance to Bull Run Lane and Williamsburg Lane shall be removed and CSA 35-

Al shall continue to maintain Bull Run Lane and Williamsburg Lane within CSA 35-AI. 16
