

BEFORE THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF FRESNO, STATE OF CALIFORNIA

RESOLUTION NO. 24-060

This Resolution expresses the County for Fresno's ("County") support in accordance with California state mandates for the inception of Countywide fleet electrification, and a dedication by the County of an eighty percent (80%) zero-emission electric vehicle adoption by 2050. This Resolution also supports the County's submission of a grant application to the United States Department of Energy, for the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant Program (EECBG).

WHEREAS, on July 8, 2008, the Board of Supervisors adopted the environmental policy package "Go Green Fresno County," to encourage superior environmental stewardship; and

WHEREAS, on September 23, 2020, the state of California passed executive order N-79-20, which expressed the State's goals that (1) one-hundred percent (100%) of in-state sales of new passenger cars and trucks will be zero-emission vehicles by 2035 and (2) one-hundred percent (100%) of medium- and heavy-duty vehicles in California be zero-emission vehicles by 2045 for all operations where feasible; and

WHEREAS, The County of Fresno Internal Services Department – Fleet Services

Division (ISD-Fleet) therefore wishes to take steps towards the County's fleet electrification, as necessary to abide by both the "Go Green Fresno County" policy and the mandates of Executive Order N-79-20, by declaring a Countywide goal of a dedication to eighty percent (80%) zero-emission electric vehicle adoption by 2050, which can include both battery powered electric vehicles and fuel cell powered electrical vehicles and

WHEREAS, on November 15, 2021, the "Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Acts" became a federal law, which funded the EECBG program for \$550 million, in order to assist eligible entities with implementation strategies to reduce fossil fuel emissions, total energy use, and to improve energy efficiency; and

WHEREAS, the County is potentially eligible for \$336,680 of those grant funds; and

WHEREAS, ISD-Fleet has established an electric vehicle infrastructure implementation "pilot" program for four County locations, which will enable the County to collect the necessary data to develop a precise and defensible electrification strategic plan for the County's fleet electrification goals; and

WHEREAS, should grant funds be awarded under the EECBG program, ISD-Fleet will return to the Board of Supervisors with a proposed plan on how the grant funds will be used in support of these goals.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED that the County's Board of Supervisors hereby expresses support for a commitment to an eighty percent zero-emission electric vehicle adoption by 2050;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED that the County's Board of Supervisors hereby grants approval for the submission of a grant application to the United States Department of Energy for the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant Program by April 30, 2024.
