Designated employees and members of the Board of Directors shall file statements of economic interests with the District. Upon receipt of the statements for the General Manager and members of the Board of Directors, the District shall make and retain a copy and forward the original of these statements to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors for the County of Fresno. The District will make retained copies of statements available for public inspection and reproduction pursuant to Government Code Section 81008.

The provision of all Conflict of Interest Codes and amendments thereto previously adopted by the District are hereby superseded.
