4 5	IN THE MATTER REGARDING TREE RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING THE
5 6	MORTALITY IN FRESNO COUNTY EXISTENCE OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY DUE TO TREE
0 7	MORTALITY AND DEGRADED FOREST CONDITIONS
8	
0 9	WHEREAS, California's national parks and managed forests are important natural resources and tourist attractions for millions of visitors from California, the United States and around the world, and serve a significant role in the California economy; and
10	
10	WHEREAS, the preservation of California's natural resources, including trees and
12	forests, conservation of upper watershed areas, promotion of better air quality, the educational opportunities trees and forests offer, the promotion of tourism, and the creation of sustainable
13	jobs are all in the best interest of the public; and
14	WHEREAS, due to four years of inadequate precipitation and drought conditions, and
15	increased insect infestation, trees on both public and private lands are dying at unprecedented
16	rates, with tree mortality rates ranging between 20% and 85% in several areas of the state and encompassing several million acres of land statewide, including in national parks and managed
17	forests; and
18	WHEREAS, the unprecedented tree mortality disaster will adversely affect the
19	watersheds that supply over half of the water used in California, dramatically increase the risk of large wildfires, diminish air quality, disrupt the food cycle, and result in increased mortality rates
20	for wildlife; and
21	WHEREAS, the tree mortality disaster in eastern Fresno County has contributed to
22	recent devastating wildfires which have resulted in an adverse effect on our environment, economy, and public well-being; and
23	economy, and public weil-being, and
24	WHEREAS, present local, statewide, and federal resources are inadequate to address proper forest management, watershed protection, and the effects of this tree mortality disaster;
25	and
26	WHEREAS, the timely removal of dead and dying trees on public lands and other areas
27	is necessary in order to help protect and maintain watersheds and wildlife habitat, protect and
28	restore forest resiliency, protect tourism and educational opportunities, and create jobs in rural communities.
29	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors that a
30	Local Emergency exists throughout Fresno County and that said Local Emergency shall be
31	deemed to continue to exist until its termination is proclaimed by the Board of Supervisors; and
32	IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED AND REQUESTED that the Governor of the State of

1	California request a Presidential Declaration of Emergency for Fresno County; and
2	
3	IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED AND REQUESTED that the State of California facilitate and support interagency coordination across local, state and federal levels to promote access to
4	resources such as expertise, equipment and human resources that are necessary to remove, store (where appropriate) and dispose of dead and dying trees using economically and
5	environmentally sustainable methods in order to restore forest and watershed health; and
6	IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED AND REQUESTED that the State of California coordinate
7	with federal and local agencies to ensure that financial assistance is available to address immediate threats to public safety and to expand, develop and make available financial tools for
8	public lands, property owners and businesses to develop capacity to reduce and manage these
9	threats; and
10	IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Proclamation be forwarded to the Governor of California and State Director of the Office of Emergency Services; and
11	
12 13	IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Administrative Officer, acting as Director of the Office of Emergency Services, hereby designate a representative of the County of Fresno
13	authorized for the purpose of, but not limited to, assessing damage, consulting with federal and/or state survey teams regarding hazard mitigation actions, processing and coordination of
15	all inquiries necessary to obtain financial and human resources available for state and federal
16	assistance.
