## IN THE MATTER OF PROCLAIMING APRIL 2018 ) CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION AWARENESS MONTH)

**RESOLUTION NO. 18-124** 

WHEREAS, between October 2016 and September 2017, 493,358 children in California were reported as alleged victims of abuse or neglect, and 20,191 of these alleged victims were children in Fresno County. All adults and caregivers have a responsibility, as neighbors, community members and citizens of Fresno County to help create a healthy, safe and nurturing environment for children and youth. Safe and healthy childhoods help produce confident, successful and independent adults; and

WHEREAS, child abuse and neglect often occurs when families or caregivers find themselves in isolated or stressful situations, without community resources and unaware of how to cope. The majority of child abuse cases stem from situations and conditions that are preventable when our communities are supportive, active and engaged; and

WHEREAS, child abuse and neglect can be reduced by making sure every family has the support it needs to raise their children in a healthy environment and with protective factors or conditions that reduce or eliminate risk and promote the social, emotional and developmental well-being of children. Effective prevention programs succeed because of meaningful connections and partnerships created between agencies, schools, faith-based organizations, law enforcement agencies and the business community; and

WHEREAS, the Fresno County Department of Social Services works diligently to ensure that children remain safe from abuse and neglect and is currently expanding child abuse prevention efforts in order to reduce the number of children from entering the child welfare system; and

WHEREAS, since 1981, the Fresno Council on Child Abuse Prevention (FCCAP), the only primary child abuse prevention agency, has served Fresno County as a Child Abuse Prevention Council by coordinating community efforts to provide prevention education services to professionals, parents and children by targeting the greatest dangers to children and families. Wearing the color blue, wearing a blue ribbon, or displaying a pinwheel in April are national symbols for child abuse prevention. The Pinwheels for Prevention campaign focuses on positive efforts to ensure that all children have the safe, stable and nurturing families they deserve.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Fresno County Board of Supervisors hereby proclaim April 2018 Child Abuse Prevention Awareness Month and urges all citizens to join FCCAP, the Department of Social Services and their engaged partners as they support each family's efforts to keep themselves and their children safe, healthy and in a nurturing environment.
