This misses the morning rush hour and traffic concerns by many hours.</p> <p>Regarding the afternoon 2:45 PM to 3:25PM it is congested everywhere in the City of Fresno, Highway City, Madera, and Clovis. It does clear pretty fast, and most drivers are very careful by knowing this fact. There aren't many incidents written about to address the safety concern. That doesn't mean, it don't exists, it means we all have to be focus and be extra careful generally in congested areas.</p> <p>Some argue that there are enough veterinarians. Pamoist veterinarian might accept new</p>
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patients. All Creatures great and small is full (and was not excepting new patients the last time checked).

Hope Animal Clinic is not a true full service clinic.

They are restrictive in allowing appointments limited to Friday for animal appointments.

H.O.P.E specializes in sterilization of animals and vaccinations. Their goal is to lessen the number of unwanted animals beforehand. Which brings it, back to the problem of housing, caring, and having a place for the adoption of those unwanted pets.

Sympathizing to all that are concern, but in reality one much needed shelter to house animals is less cars and traffic then all the fears and the running of imaginations when comparing the other possible outcomes...

Should apartment complexes go up, or more multi mix densities, or low income homes go in place of the Shelter, it would make everyone who paid upwards of \$ 500,000.00 crying Foul or "There goes the neighborhood."

Dumping of "strays"
There wouldn't be strays, if everyone were responsible. Animals

dropped off at Fresno humane because no collar or chip and they were starving, or injured, or just plain abandoned is the shelters purpose. Strays are everywhere and many help, voluntarily with the recovery, dropping off to shelters, or by rehoming themselves. There are few who will abandon but not in numbers which are a concern.

Here is a worthwhile hard-working, highly responsible organization that has proven It's worth. They take very good care of all the animals in spite of a tight budget. They pull resources, they genuinely want what's best for all animals.

How can a few of you out there say yes, " I rescued my dog(s), my cat(s), my rabbit(s), my horse etc, "then state" I don't want this shelter here and put them elsewhere"

Has anybody ever check them out personally...that's complaining about them?

It's an ideal site with potentially some hiccups but, It's not the worst thing that can occur on the use of this land.

It's wishful thinking is to believe that the land will stay as is, it won't. 30

years ago, I bought my home surrounded by fig groves, and almonds to the north, east and west of me today there are none. Now, Blight and graffiti, homeless living on golden state, in the olive trees or by the canal. On the west end of Bullard, It's a dumping ground behind the empire storage. It's an on going problem within our city and most major cities.

How many would be objecting, if a drug/alcohol rehab facility went there, a halfway home (plan for homeless) for parolees in a single bed facility, or a legal tiny homes village?

I don't mind a shelter, I have visited them and found them staff by loving, passionate, kind individuals who want good people to connect with and adopt dogs and cats who are far too often societies cast offs.
