RESOLUTION NO. 18-290

WHEREAS, the non-profit Fresno Cycling Club will hold the 14th Annual "Bass Lake Double Century" event, which will involve over 10,000 feet of climbing during the 200-mile route; and

WHEREAS, the "Bass Lake Double Century" event, one of the double century events recognized for earning the coveted Triple Crown award for completing 3 doubles in one year, will be held on Saturday, Oct 13, 2018; and

WHEREAS, 150 – 200 participants from California, Nevada, Colorado, and Washington will be supported by over 100 volunteers during this Fresno County event; and


WHEREAS, the Fresno Cycling Club has applied to the State of California to conduct the "Bass Lake Double Century" bicycling event on State property; and

WHEREAS, the "Bass Lake Double Century" bicycling event may temporarily impede and restrict the free passage of traffic over State Highway Route 168 on Saturday, October 13, 2018 between S.J. & E. Road and Prather between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Fresno County Board of Supervisors hereby approves and consents to the proposed "Bass Lake Double Century" bicycling event and recommends approval of and consents to the proposed restriction of State Highway Route 168 upon terms and conditions deemed appropriate and necessary by the State of California, Department of Transportation.
