6	WHEREAS. The City of Senger was founded because of a decision by Southern Decific
7	WHEREAS, The City of Sanger was founded because of a decision by Southern Pacific Railroad to build a branch line to serve farms on the east side of the San Joaquin Valley. In March 1888, a spike was driven into the ground next to the roadbed about four miles southwest of Centerville. The Town that was laid out around that spike was named after Joseph Sanger
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9	Jr.; and
10	WHEREAS, With industries quickly locating to the Sanger area, the population began to
11	transform from a transient populous to a stable population, with pioneering businessmen opening shops in the town. As the town grew, social functions became a part of daily life, and
12	some of the men who met in those early years were members of Masonic lodges in other parts of the state. After a few organizational meetings, a formal request for dispensation to meet was
13	forwarded to the Grand Lodge of California; and
14	WHEREAS, The dispensation was granted on January 16, 1893, and after careful
15	review of the activities and membership of the lodge, a Charter was issued on October 11, 1893, officially authorizing Sanger Masonic Lodge to become Sanger Masonic Lodge, No. 316
16	under the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of California; and
17	WHEREAS, The mission of the Sanger Lodge is to promote a way of life that binds like-
18	minded men in a worldwide brotherhood that transcends all religious, ethnic, cultural, social and educational differences. That by teaching the great principles of brotherly love, relief and truth;
19	and, by the outward expression of these through its fellowship, to find ways in which to serve family, country, neighbors and self. Through Masonic principles and tradition, they foster
20	personal growth and improve the lives of others; and
21	WHEREAS, In 1932, they purchased the "Kittle Building" and have called the building
22	home ever since. Today, the Sanger Lodge consists of 71 active members, and 17 Masonic Widows. For the last 125 years, Sanger Masons have been active in a variety of community
23	and philanthropic actives in the Sanger area.
24	NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Fresno County Board of Supervisors
25	hereby recognize the Sanger Masonic Lodge, No. 316 on their achievement of being an active club in the Sanger Community for 125 years.
