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

Fact six, the zip code where the 4.1 acres is located, the 93722 and the neighboring 93723 is the highest call for service tier that Fresno Humane dispatch responds to. More calls come from this area of the county than any other area by 2.5 times. So, response time would be greatly reduced if the facility was located at the proposed site, as there are no animal control operations in the northwest quadrant of the city.

Fact seven, if the Board of Supervisors choose to not vote yes on the rezone and this land stays as Rural Residential. The Board of Supervisors will need to explain to taxpayers why they will need to quickly get a new facility built at taxpayer's expense instead of taking a gifted facility that can become a very positive, nurturing influence in the area and on the lives of those that live there, just as the case with Valley Animal Center, Bully Rescue, Mrs. Winkles.

If this land stays as Rural Residential, what a shame, however that land will be developed and under current Rural Residential Zoning, that 4.1 acres can house the population of confiscated roosters and poultry from the illegal blood sporting events happening in the county's fields and orchards. Right now, legally 2,000 birds and over one dozen, horse pigs, bovine, sheep, goats or any combination plus their offspring may be housed on these four acres. That's right now, today. So, what shall it be?

In response to the current proposed change of zoning for the proposed Animal Shelter and Hospital from Residential to Commercial/Industrial, we residents are opposed. The residents of the area are not against animals but against consideration of the council to consider putting one in such an already trafficked area. Most of the residents have pets and love animals but have to deal with traffic congestion daily. It should be noted that a

Veterinary Hospital is not needed in NW Fresno as we already have HOPE Animal Foundaton, All Creatures Veterinary Clinic, and Pamoist Pet Hospital within a close distance.

The proposed site is in a currently traffic constricted area and will contribute further to this problem we face daily. The traffic flow and commuters are restricted by only having two egresses over 99, W. Shaw & W. Herndon. This also directly impacts Emergency Medical Services in response to emergencies. Our infrastructure is outdated and no life-line is being thrown to the NW Fresno district 2 residents. The approval of such an addition, namely an animal shelter, is proposed on Grantland Ave near the Hwy 99 South ramp (single lane), next to the Dante Club, next to and across the street from 2 churches and County residential homes, which will undoubtedly add to the current traffic congestion.

The proposed project, if built, will also sit catty-corner to Herndon-Barstow Elementary where traffic bottlenecks on the single lane road. It now becomes a safety issue for children, parents, and school transportation vehicles. Even more importantly, per Dept. of Public Health, Fresno Humane Animal Services does not perform background checks on volunteers. This is of great concern considering the elementary school is within walking distance.




FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS


What is the Board of Supervisors voting on?

Fresno Humane Animal Services (applicant) and Derrel Ridenour (current landowner) have applied to rezone 2 adjacent parcels of land totaling 4.15 acres from Rural Residential to Limited Industrial M-1(c) to allow only for an animal shelter/hospital and associated uses related to an animal shelter.

Where is it located?

The property is located on GRANTLAND AVENUE BETWEEN PARKWAY AND TENAYA and will share a property line with the church at Parkway and Grantland. (See map)





What will be built on the site?

The proposed ANIMAL SHELTER will consist of 5 buildings—main administration & visitor services in the front along Grantland, 3 kennel wings behind that, and a large animal barn in the back along Highway 99.



Why here?

This location was selected for several reasons:

- It has excellent visibility due to frontage along Highway 99.
- It is in an area of growth and commercial development. In fact, future city annexation of the property
 will by default change the zoning to commercial and pave the way for business development on that parcel
 if the shelter isn't already in place.
- There are no existing animal shelters or rescue facilities in northwest Fresno, yet there is a need. Calls for service in the 93723 zone are higher than the county average. The majority of our adopters are from the north side of town, as well.
- It's in close proximity to Fresno Humane's veterinary partners

Will an animal hospital be built there?

Plans do NOT include an animal hospital or clinic.

Is it a government project?

NO. It will not be owned or funded by Fresno County. Fresno Humane currently contracts with Fresno County to provide animal control services, but FHAS also acts as a private animal welfare agency to provide services to pets and residents of both the county and city.

Will it be noisy?

NO. Acoustic studies predict no significant impact on ambient noise due to shelter activities. Mitigation strategies include: kennels designed to reduce stress and barking, sound-dampening construction materials, sound barriers on the perimeter, and restriction of dogs to inside kennels at night.

Will it be smelly?

NO. Environmental studies predict no significant impact on air quality or odor in the immediate area. Mitigation strategies include: filtered air exchange systems, specially designed flushing floor basins to reduce odor and flies in waste containers, daily sanitizing.

How will it impact traffic?

Traffic studies show a less than significant impact on local traffic.

- The shelter opens to the public at 10:00am to avoid commute and school drop-off traffic.
- Current shelter traffic is relatively light—fewer than a dozen cars per hour.
- The majority of shelter traffic will not pass by the school or neighborhoods to the south.
- Grantland Avenue along the project's frontage will be widened and improved.

Will it make my neighborhood or school unsafe?

NO. There is no evidence that animal shelters such as this bring with them any added safety issues.

- All areas of the property, inside and out, will be monitored 24-7 by surveillance cameras. This includes the street and front fence line.
- Signs will be clearly posted along the front gate to alert visitors that animal abandonment is a crime, and to notify that violators will be videotaped and reported to law enforcement. Contact information for oncall animal control officers, the sheriff's department, and our partner emergency hospital will be posted.
- Officers will be available on-call 24-hours a day, 7 days a week. Service calls from the nearby school and immediate neighborhoods will be given Priority 1 status.

Will livestock be housed on the property?

YES, but intake of horses, pigs, goats, sheep, and birds is minimal. On average, 1 or 2 horses or small livestock are housed at any given time; often we have none.

Will this rezone will open the door to further rezoning in the area?

The 4.15 acre parcel between Parkway and Tenaya is the ONLY area being voted on by the Board. Any further rezoning would be required to go through the application and approval process, which would include neighborhood notification and public hearing.

Will this decrease my property value?

There is no evidence that the project will negatively affect property values in the neighborhoods nearby. A comparable animal shelter, Miss Winkle's, was constructed in Clovis in 2013. Five years late, home values around the shelter show steady increase. Date: October 22, 2018

In the month & a half since we last stood before you, we've spent a considerable amount of time reaching out to the residents near the project site. We have listened to their concerns and addressed the issues as best we can through a well-attended neighborhood meeting, emails, phone calls, door-to-door conversations, and even Supervisor Pacheco's Facebook page. We've met those concerns regarding noise, odor, traffic, safety, and property with independent studies and empirical evidence proving that the shelter will have NO significant negative impact. Even still, we've added some additional mitigation features to our operational statement to further address those issues.

In the process of reaching out, we have found that many neighbors do NOT oppose the rezone or the shelter in that location—in fact, many welcome Fresno Humane to the area. In just the past few days we've collected nearly 100 new letters of support and petition signatures from people within a ½ mile of the site. That's on top of the thousands we have already received from supporters throughout Fresno city and county.

What we are left with is a very vocal minority of neighbors who have based their opposition on the fear of what MIGHT happen If the property is rezoned and the shelter is built. None of those fears is grounded in actual evidence. The only concern with any legitimacy is the likelihood of further commercialization in the area—but according to the city's general plan, that's destined to happen regardless of whether or not these 4 acres are rezoned. In fact, placement of the shelter and a future ministorage facility would probably be a best-case scenario given the other possibilities.

A question that has come up again and again is, why there? Why not somewhere else? Part of the reason is good business—because of visibility along the highway, we'll get free advertising and people will actually be able to find the shelter (that's an issue for us at the current location). It's very close to our spay & neuter clinic (HOPE) and our vet's office, and has easy access to 99. It's also in an area already slated for growth and commercial development that is underserved by existing animal welfare agencies. If you look at a map of animal shelters and rescue facilities in Fresno, none of them are located north of Ashlan. Yet most of our adopters live in north Fresno zip codes, and calls for service and stray intakes in the 93723 zip code are actually higher than the countywide average. We aren't forcing a shelter where it doesn't belong, we're bringing a shelter to where it's needed and where it is most likely to succeed.

One statement from a letter written in opposition stands out to me as a reflect on the past month's correspondence. "...construction of the shelter will bring about stray animals that might also be sick or lame. The children of the neighborhood and school should not be subjected to animals in these

conditions. Students will suffer negative impacts upon their physical and emotional well-being." First off, there's no evidence that the shelter will bring ANY increase in loose dogs at the school. We're across the street from a school now and we just don't see it. But I found the sentiment embodied in the statement very upsetting. Just seeing animals in need will upset their kids? How can we help those who need it if we won't even look at them? How can we fix our community's problems if we won't even allow the solutions to exist in our neighborhoods?? Instead of teaching our children to turn a blind eye to those who need our help, shouldn't we instead model compassion?

I don't need to convince you that Fresno needs a new animal shelter—you've seen what we have. I don't need to convince you that Fresno Humane Animal Services is a competent agency committed to the cause—you've seen that, too. This shelter is not only a gift to Fresno Humane, it's a gift to Fresno's animals and to every single resident. Please don't let the unfounded fears of a small group outweigh the needs of our entire community. Please don't let fear of the unknown win out over compassion and reason.

This is my second letter to you, and I hope that my first letter resonated with you and the other members of the Board. Since writing that letter, I watched the live stream of the last Board meeting regarding this matter, and I now have a better idea of the factors that need to be considered. You and your fellow Board members must consider the benefits that this new shelter will provide, but also the impacts it could have on the residents whom you represent.

What I noticed from virtually all of the public comments in opposition to the new shelter is that they fear impacts which have already been thoroughly addressed. I have read through the Mitigated Negative Declaration which was prepared for this Initial Study Application and every potential impact has been concluded to be less than significant, either with or without mitigation.

Please remember that no new development evades public opposition to some extent. And while some new development may truly be worthy of considering an opposing vote, this is simply not that kind of development. In short, the immense good that this facility will do for the County of Fresno is unprecedented and far outweighs any amount of public disapproval. Additionally, the public disapproval that I heard in the last Board meeting seems a moot point as the issues that were discussed are either non-existent by the sheer nature of this project, or have already been adequately addressed in the Mitigation Negative Declaration.

It is simply unfair to put Fresno Humane through the heartbreaking disapproval of this new shelter when they have done everything that was asked of them to be compliant and earn your approval. The location that was generously provided to Fresno Humane is a rare gift that doesn't come around often. To propose a change of location would destroy the hard work that Fresno Humane has done, and I fear for how many innocent lives would be lost in the time it would take them to start over from square one.

Please, from the bottom of my heart and the hearts of all the animals who still need saving, give Fresno Humane a fighting chance to continue doing good for their community... a community that desperately needs some good brought to it.

Since writing that letter, I watched the live stream of the last Board meeting regarding this matter, and I now have a better idea of the factors that need to be considered. You and your fellow Board members must consider the benefits that this new shelter will provide, but also the impacts it could have on the residents whom you represent.

What I noticed from virtually all of the public comments in opposition to the new shelter is that they fear impacts which have already been thoroughly addressed. I have read through the Mitigated Negative Declaration which was prepared for this Initial Study Application and every potential impact has been concluded to be less than significant, either with or without mitigation.

Please remember that no new development evades public opposition to some extent. And while some new development may truly be worthy of considering an opposing vote, this is simply not that kind of development. Good day Gentlemen, Lance Minnite here a Fresno County resident, in the Fresno County Island of Old Fig Proper District under Supervision of Mr. Borgeas.

Gentlemen, thank you for the consideration of all sides to this very simple situation. I ask that you move forward with a yes vote to rezone the subject acerage based on black and white facts over, supposition, imagination, manipulation and fabrication.

The very simple black and white facts are:

Fact one, 6 years ago the Board of Supervisors committed to temporarily house the animal control facility at the abandoned parking lot of the condemned county morgue building for 90 days.

Fact two, 6 years later, the county animal control services are still being operated at the 90 day temporary site. The condition of the surface yard and condemn morgue have deteriorated to such levels that its actually, now a hazard for people walking the grounds and into the crumbling, condemned morgue building, as they do daily.

Fact three, where county government has failed to honor its agreement to the taxpayers of Fresno County and build a new facility, instead choose to throw tax dollars at a crumbling condemn morgue, private enterprise has stepped forward to make good on the Board of Supervisors' broken commitment made 6 years ago.

Fact four, with citizen access to deteriorated and condemned structures the County of Fresno is vulnerable to litigation over public access to hazardous and condemned structures. So, a speedy move from the temporary site would be in the county's best interest.

Fact five, the 4.1 acres proposed to house the animal control operations have proven in all studies to be of no negative impact what so ever on the area.

Fact six, the zip code where the 4.1 acres is located, the 93722 and the neighboring 93723 is the highest call for service tier that Fresno Humane dispatch responds to. More calls come from this area of the county than any other area by 2.5 times. So, response time would be greatly reduced if the facility was located at the proposed site, as there are no animal control operations in the northwest quadrant of the city.

Fact seven, if the Board of Supervisors choose to not vote yes on the rezone and this land stays as Rural Residential. The Board of Supervisors will need to explain to taxpayers why they will need to quickly get a new facility built at taxpayer's expense instead of taking a gifted facility that can become a very positive, nurturing influence in the area and on the lives of those that live there, just as the case with Valley Animal Center, Bully Rescue, Mrs. Winkles.

If this land stays as Rural Residential, what a shame, however that land will be developed and under current Rural Residential Zoning, that 4.1 acres can house the population of confiscated roosters and poultry from the illegal blood sporting events happening in the county's fields and orchards. Right now, legally 2,000 birds and over one dozen, horse pigs, bovine, sheep, goats or any combination plus their offspring may be housed on these four acres. That's right now, today. So, what shall it be?

Good evening,

I'm emailing in regards to the proposed shelter for Fresno Humane Animal Services and to express my support for it.

At the last meeting, some of the area residents stated their concern about having a shelter so close to a school and their homes because of safety risks and noise/odor problems. Through my involvement with the both the Fresno Bully Rescue and Fresno Humane Animals Services, it is my understanding that the site of the proposed shelter is a popular dumping area for animals and animal corpses. Having FHAS and their animal control officers on site would actually reduce health and safety risks. People that abandon animals for the sake of convenience rather than driving them across town to FHAS's current location or the SPCA could instead surrender them in the same spot that they would have dumped them; this means fewer animals wandering near the school and houses. And if a dog got out of its backyard or was just homeless in the area, the animal control officers would be quicker to respond because they don't have to make the 20-minute drive from the shelter. With professionals at the new site, there would also be someone to remove the bodies, limiting potential health consequences and emotional disturbance of the adults and children in the area.

Noise and odor are reasonable concerns when discussing a place to keep dogs, but the animals would be inside a facility designed for them, one meant to keep barking from disturbing the general public. And at the current facility, the smell is only noticeable when crouched down over the AstroTurf. AstroTurf doesn't drain like real grass and won't evaporate as

efficiently as blacktop or concrete, but the smell is still only noticeable when crouched down to dog height. I couldn't even smell it while standing on top of it at full height.

The shelter's current location, the parking lot of the old morgue, does not provide adequate accommodation to the 200+ animals on site. But even in the crowded, exposed location across the street from Pershing High School, every dog I've met at FHAS is friendly, happy, and grateful for the staff that takes care of them. There is often a fear of homeless dogs because people don't know what level of socialization the animal has had, what their temperament is, or if they might bite, but in the hundreds of hours I've spent volunteering with shelter animals, I've never been bitten, scratched, or afraid. This has held true at FHAS, Merced County Humane Society, SPCA, and Fresno Bully Rescue, a rescue that specializes in bully breeds, which are heavily stigmatized as aggressive, violent dogs. Attached are pictures of dogs from all of the aforementioned rescues taken minutes after meeting them, including some of me in an enclosed pin with them. And there are many more with dogs of all shapes and sizes that couldn't fit on this email.

I know that a former Madera Animal Control officer brought to the last meeting pictures of her face after getting bitten while on duty. Based on that experience, she and I'm sure many other parents present were worried about having a shelter near their children's school. But animal control officers put themselves in potentially dangerous situations so that members of the public don't have to. The officers at FHAS will respond to the call of a stray near the school so that teachers with no training on how to handle animals don't have to put themselves in that situation, and kids don't handle the animal indelicately and risk that it gets scared and snaps at them. My nephew goes to daycare in the zip code, at God's Family Church, and I know that I would feel much better about stray animals showing up with some frequency if trained professionals would be quickly dispatched to the location. He's autistic and doesn't understand that pulling and pushing on tails, ears, and legs will likely get him at least a bark in the face, especially because the dogs he's around at home are pitbulls so they don't mind him literally falling into a sitting position on top of them.

As I mentioned, the current FHAS shelter is a parking lot, exposed to the extreme heats of Fresno summers and our usually wet winters, but the Ridenours have shown unbelievable generosity in wanting to change that. They want to donate the land and build the structure, but they can only do it on that piece of land in 97323. Things are very unlikely to change for Nala, Tommy, and everyone else at FHAS without the rezoning of the land being donated by the Ridenours. Fresno County would have to take on the responsibility of finding the land and financing the building of the shelter instead of just approving the location and watching dedicated patrons and motivated professionals bring an incredible shelter into existence.

I go to school in Merced, so I regretfully won't make the vote and can't speak in person, but hopefully a 93722 resident currently living in another city, busy with volunteering, work, and school making time to stay informed about the situation and put in writing her complete support for FHAS in some way shows how important this shelter is. Unfortunately I wasn't able to write a very articulate letter of support, but hopefully its substance is enough.
