5	WHEREAS, toop doting violonce, also known as dating abuse, is a serious and growing problem			
6 7	WHEREAS, teen dating violence, also known as dating abuse, is a serious and growing problem throughout California, and teen dating violence intervention and prevention programs can help to ensure a positive school climate and safe learning environment for all youth ages 12 to 24; and			
8	WHEREAS, consistent with the Center for Disease Control and Prevention's recommendations			
9	for a comprehensive primary prevention program, multiple strategies are required such as teaching sa and healthy relationship skills, engaging influential adults and peers, disrupting the developmental			
10	pathways toward partner violence, creating protective environments, strengthening economic supports for families, and supporting survivors to increase safety and lessen harm; and			
11	WHEREAS, Each year, an estimated 1 in 10 high school students is physically hurt on purpose			
12	by a dating partner; and according to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention, Dating Matters: Strategies to Promote Healthy Teen Relationships, 1 in 3 adolescents report verbal, emotional, physical,			
13	or sexual dating abuse each year; and			
14	WHEREAS, teen dating violence has been linked to other forms of violence and aggression			
15 16	against peers, including bullying, sexual harassment, sexual violence, and physical violence, while survivors of teen dating violence have increased risk for truancy, dropout, teen pregnancy, suicide, eating disorders, and engaging in other harmful behaviors such as use of alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs; and			
17	WHEREAS, nearly half of the students who experience dating violence have reported that some			
18	of the abuse took place on school grounds. Youth who are survivors in high school are at higher risk for victimization during college, and adolescent perpetrators of dating violence are more likely to abuse their intimate partners as adults.			
19	NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Fresno County Board of Supervisors hereby			
20	proclaims February 2019 as Teen Dating Violence Awareness Month in Fresho County and calls upon the people of Fresho County to observe Teen Dating Violence Awareness Month with programs and			
21	activities that raise awareness about the dynamics of teen dating violence and support youth in learning			
22 23	the skills to have safe and healthy relationships.
