**RESOLUTION NO. 19-091**

**IN THE MATTER OF PROCLAIMING MARCH 17 – 23, 2019)  
AS “NATIONAL SAFE PLACE WEEK” )**

**WHEREAS**, March 17 through 23, 2019 is National Safe Place Week, and Sanctuary and Youth Services, administered by Fresno Economic Opportunities Commission, will join in this national celebration to recognize local businesses, community organizations, youth service agencies, and volunteers that are part of the Safe Place program and work for the safety and well-being of Fresno County's youth; and

**WHEREAS**, A “Safe Place” is a safe haven for young people in crisis. Sanctuary's SafePlace project and its network of over 300 partner sites throughout Fresno County is committed to protecting our nation's most valuable asset, our youth; and

**WHEREAS**, Fresno EOC's Sanctuary Youth Shelter is an emergency shelter for runaway, homeless or at-risk youth ages 12-18. The Sanctuary Youth Shelter is the only self-referral emergency shelter within a 15,000 square mile radius and is open 24 hours-a-day, 7 days a week with emergency assistance to approximately 300 youth annually; and

**WHEREAS**, In California, nearly 300,000 youth up to age 18 experience homelessness. The City of Fresno reports approximately 350 missing persons/runaway cases of youth per month while the Department of Justice reports in 2017, 4,030 children were reported as missing in Fresno County. There are approximately 4,848 children homeless or at-risk of homelessness attending school in the County of Fresno; and


**WHEREAS**, Today more than 370,215 youth have been helped at one of the more than 20,000 Safe Place locations nationwide or received counseling by phone as a result of Safe Place information received at schools last year; Since 1997, Sanctuary has administered the Safe Place program providing education and assisted nearly 250,000 youth and adults; and

**WHEREAS**, National Safe Place Network operates in 38 states and in more than 1,430 communities throughout the United States, including Fresno, CA. Increased awareness will encourage more communities to establish Safe Place locations where youth can readily access the help they need.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Fresno County Board of Supervisors hereby proclaims March 17 through 23, 2019 as “National Safe Place Week” in the County of Fresno.
