Presented before your Board today is an item to consider and take action on a request for determination of public convenience or necessity on application for Type 20 Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) License filed by Poonia Family Enterprises, LLC.

- * License Type 20 (Off-Sale Beer & Wine): Authorizes the sale of beer and wine for consumption off the premises where sold.

FRESNO COUNTY POLICY MANAGEMENT DIRECTIVE 2400

County policy requires the following criteria to be considered before a determination of public convenience or necessity can be met:

1. The issuance of a license would not tend to create a law enforcement problem and increase the level of crime activity.
2. The issuance of a license would provide a needed service to the community and that without this use there would be an inconvenience to the community.
3. The issuance of a license will have a positive impact on the local economy including the creation of new jobs.

The determination of public convenience and necessity alone does not guarantee the applicant will receive a license from CDABC. The issuance of a license is totally within the discretion of the CDABC, and the applicant must also comply with other requirements of CDABC and other applicable land use and health and safety code requirements.

RESPONSE

- * The applicant provided a written response, which is included within the agenda item. The applicant is available for questions.
- * The Department of Public Works was contacted. There are no zoning issues relating to this application.
- * The Fresno County Sheriff's Department was contacted and reviewed this application.

STATISTICS

- * Applicant is in Census Tract 59.05
- * 6 off-sale licenses are allowed by ABC in this census tract
- * There is one existing off-sale license in this census tract, and one pending license.
- * There is a moratorium on the issuance of off-sale (Type 20) licenses for Fresno County where the ratio of licenses exceeds one for each 2,500 inhabitants.
- * Due to this moratorium, ABC must deny the application unless your Board determines that public convenience or necessity would be served by the issuance

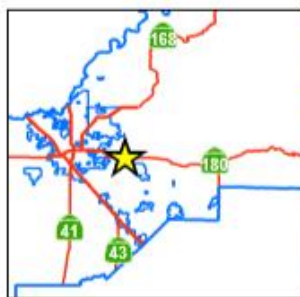


Existing ABC Licenses Locations in Census Tract 59.05 ABC Licenses Applicant: 50 S McCall Ave. & CA-180

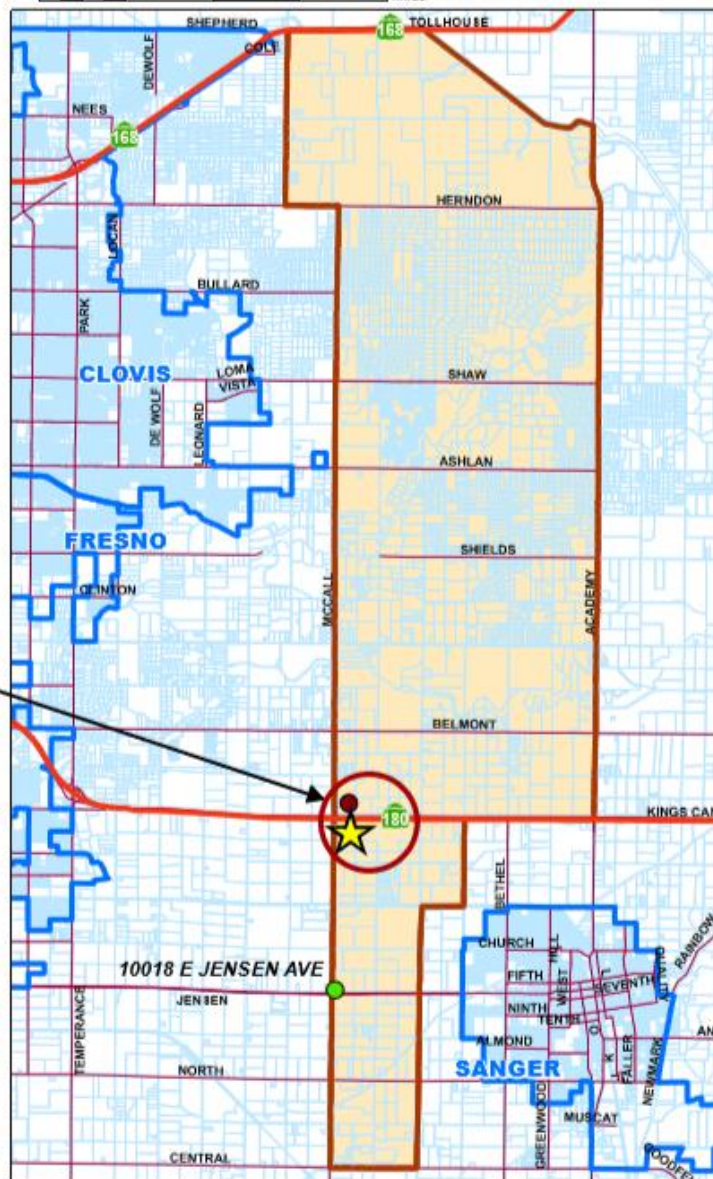

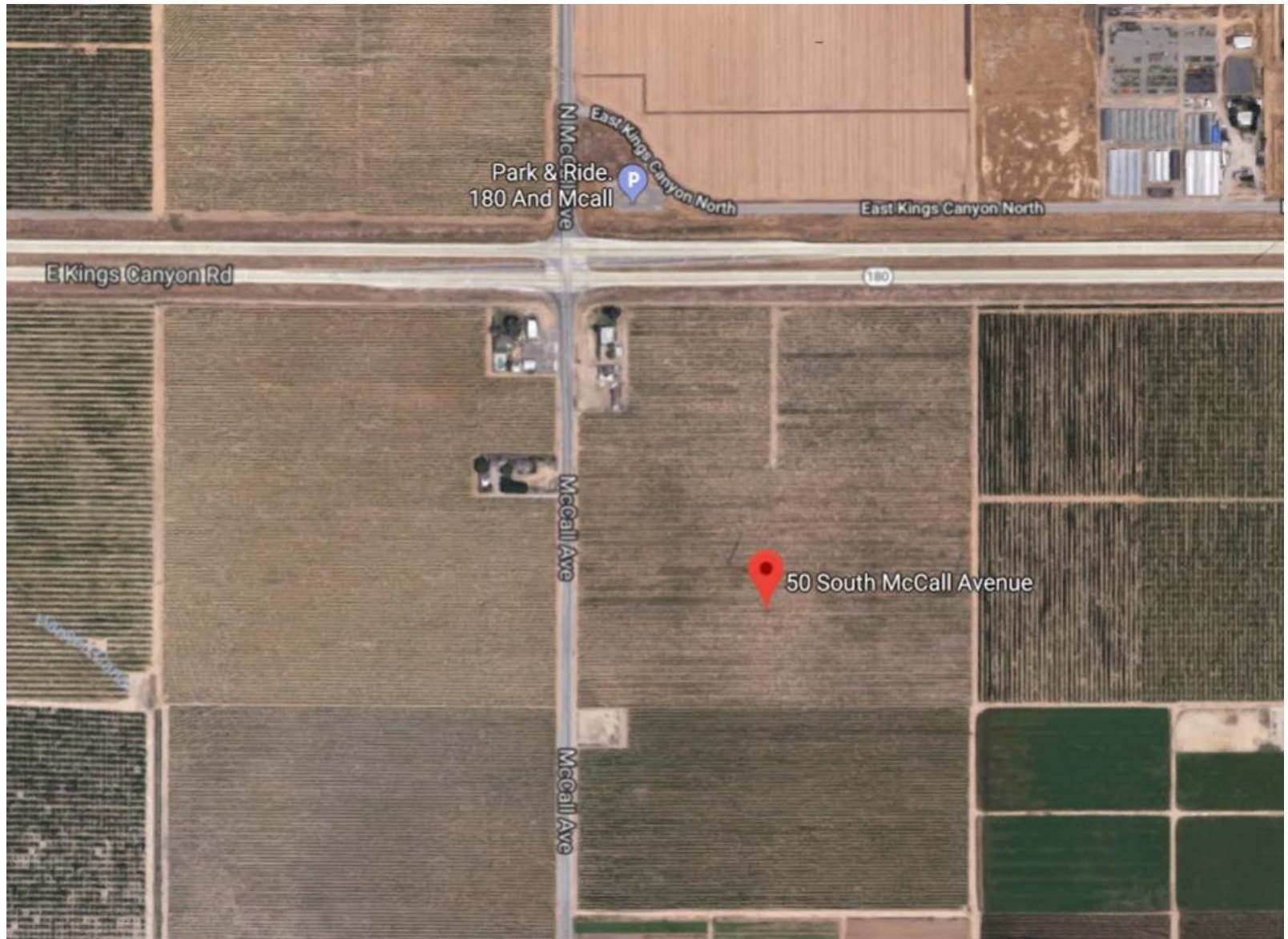
