## Letter of Intent

### 1. Statement of Need

This cover letter is to respectfully request assistance from the California Department of Parks and Recreation, Division of Boating and Waterways, for the upkeep of three patrol boats, and for the purchase of needed personal protective equipment. If selected, the Fresno County Sheriff's Office will repaint three patrol boats, purchase and install new decals on those three boats, and purchase eight swift water rescue dry suits.

The three vessels we are requesting to repaint are a 2004 Design Concepts 22' patrol boat, and a 2016 and 2017 Rogue Jet Boatworks Coastal 24' patrol boat. 2004 Design Concepts patrol boat has seen over 2500 hours of service. Being fifteen years old and having so many hours of service, the exterior paint of the patrol boat has many dings and scratches, which degrades its outward appearance. In order to improve the vessels professional appearance we are requesting to repaint the exterior of the vessel.

When purchased the exterior of the 2016 and 2017 Rogue patrol boats were wrapped with a white vinyl material. After a couple years of service we have learned that the vinyl wrap does not hold up well to everyday wear and tear from conducting numerous vessel stop and inspections, as well as, maneuvering in and around docks. The vinyl wrap has developed numerous nicks, dings, scratches, and tears making the appearance of the vessel subpar. The vinyl also tends to peel and tear if a scratch or nick starts near a corner, further degrading the aesthetics of the boat. There is no way of repairing a scratch or nick in the vinyl wrap without having to replace large sections. The vinyl wrap cannot be touched up or easily repaired like paint can. Our unit has already had to replace large sections of the vinyl wrap on one of the boats, which is very expensive and difficult to apply. Based on this experience we believe that removing the deteriorated wrap and painting the exterior of the boat with a strong marine grade paint will be very beneficial and cost effective. Marine grade paint tends to be much more resilient to scratches, nicks, and dings. The paint can easily be touched up and scratches or dings can be polished out. The Fresno County Sheriff's Office Boating Enforcement Unit is therefore requesting to repaint the 2016 and 2017 Rogue patrol boats, as well as, the 2004 Design Concepts patrol boat.

If granted, the unit is also requesting to purchase eight new Kokatat Gore-tex dry suits to issue to our boating deputies and reserves. On busy weekends upwards of a thousand people or more a day float down the Kings River on inner-tubes. During the 2017-2018 boating season boating deputies with the Fresno County Sheriff's Office conducted over 1,200 swift water rescues on the Counties two major rivers and miles of irrigation canals. During the course of performing these rescues deputies are exposed to cold water temperatures for prolonged periods of time and could face hypothermia if not properly equipped. Deputies can also be exposed to biological hazards associated with decomposition or pesticide runoff and need to be properly protected and equipped. Dry suits will greatly increase a deputy's thermal protection against the environment and biological hazards. Dry suits also allow deputies to quickly don their rescue PPE over their uniform, increasing their response time. These dry suits offer added reinforced protections around the knees and elbows to prevent deputies from being injured against jagged rocks and branches. For many years our unit has relied upon wetsuits that are now approaching 20 years old and are no longer serviceable. Many of the wetsuits are ripped, torn, and have holes. The wetsuits also do not provide the best protection against contaminants and take a prolonged period of time to don on and doff.

The painting of the exterior of our boats will greatly improve the professional appearance of our fleet. The purchase of new dry suits will greatly increase the quality of personal protective equipment available to deputies performing swift water rescues and reduce their likely hood of injury. These components will both dramatically increase our ability to deliver effective and efficient service to the citizens of Fresno County.

The details of the proposed improvements to or vessel and the purchase of new equipment are as follows:

- Repaint exterior of three patrol vessels - \$5,300.31
- New decals for repainted vessels – \$1,614.23
- Installation of decals – \$1,400.00

- Eight Kokatat Gore-tex dry suits - \$7384.76

The estimated total cost for the above listed items is \$15,699.30.

### 3. Describe your agency's boating safety and enforcement activities

The Fresno County Sheriff's Office Boating Enforcement Unit consists of one full-time Sergeant and two full-time Deputy Sheriffs who work in the unit year round. During the peak summer months, between May and September, the unit hires four additional Deputy Sheriff's and six paid Reserve Deputies.

During the summer boating season six, two-person teams patrol at least forty hours a week on the County's eleven waterways. The Boating Enforcement Unit enforces all Federal, State, and County regulations relating to all water and boating activities. The unit is responsible for all water related search and rescue operations, drowned body recoveries, and vessel accident investigation. The unit is very proactive, conducting over 1,200 vessel inspections and performing more than 1,200 swift water rescues during the 2017 – 2018 fiscal year. Throughout the year deputies also participate in numerous parades, outdoor community events, and water safety presentations.

**5. Describe the recreational boating activity on your waterways:**

At 6,000 square miles, Fresno County is the fifth largest county in California. As such, it has many recreational boating waterways and opportunities available for public use. Fresno County contains nine lakes and two rivers for boaters to utilize, totaling approximately 129 miles of navigable waters. The lakes and sloughs of Fresno County provide recreational boaters with approximately 27 square miles of water. These waterways range in elevation from approximately 100' to 8,000'. The County's largest lake, Pine Flat Lake, holds about one million acre feet of water and occupies 9.5 square miles. Another popular Fresno County lake, Shaver Lake, has seen a 400% increase in recreational boating activity over the course of the past ten years. Additionally, the County has over 930 miles of irrigation canals which are frequently used by the public for swimming and fishing. The Kings River attracts people from all over the state whom float down a 10 mile section on inner-tubes. On weekends, it is not uncommon for there to be more than one thousand people per day floating down class II rapids in boats and tubes designed for pools. Most Fresno County waterways are used on a year round basis, though the busiest recreational use takes place between Memorial Day and Labor Day.
