4	TO LEVY BENEFIT ASSESSMENT FOR ROAD MAINTENANCE COSTS ON REAL PROPERTY IN COUNTY SERVICE AREA NO. 35, ZONE "AJ"	
5	WHEREAS, Fresno County Ordinance Code section 17.72.358 provides that prior to the	
6	recordation of the final map of a subdivision containing any improved local public or private	
7	roads, the subdivider shall have provided for their maintenance by a county service area or	
8	other method acceptable to the Director of Public Works and Planning (Director); and	
9	WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors (Board) established County Service Area No. 35	
10	to provide road maintenance services for developments in the unincorporated area of Fresno	
11	County;	
12	WHEREAS, the County of Fresno (County) provides road maintenance services in	
13	County Service Area No. 35 through zones established under Article 8 of the County Service	
14	Area Law (Government Code sections 25217 through 25217.4), including zone AJ of County	
15	Service Area No. 35 (CSA 35-AJ); and	
16	WHEREAS, to comply with a condition of approval for Tentative Parcel Map 8160, which	
17	condition is required by Ordinance Code section 17.72.368, a developer-landowner has	
18	requested a boundary change for CSA 35-AJ to include the two parcels described by Tentative	
19	Parcel Map 8160; and	
20	WHEREAS, the purpose of CSA 35-AJ is to provide maintenance to a public road known	
21	as East Reno Avenue, which maintenance is funded by assessments levied within on properties	
22	that receive a special benefit from that maintenance; and	
23	WHEREAS, under Government Code section 25217.4, subdivision (c), benefit	
24	assessments to pay for road maintenance services in CSA 35-AJ must be levied, assessed, and	
25	charged only within the boundaries of CSA 35-AJ; and	
26	WHEREAS, under Proposition 218, a benefit assessment must be levied on all	
27	properties that receive a special benefit from the services to be funded by the benefit	
28	assessment; and	

1	WHEREAS, territory in addition to Tentative Parcel Map 8160 and in addition to that
2	within the current boundaries of CSA 35-AJ, which additional territory is generally identified by
3	Assessor's Parcel Numbers (APN) 580-010-11S, 580-010-12S, 580-010-14S, 580-010-15, 580-
4	010-18S, 580-010-22, and 580-010-24, and more particularly identified by the map and
5	description attached as Exhibit A to this resolution, located west of Auberry Road, and adjacent
6	to the current boundaries of CSA 35-AJ, also receives a special benefit from the maintenance of
7	East Reno Avenue and must be included in the properties subject to benefit assessment for
8	those services; and
9	WHEREAS, for the reasons stated above, a boundary change for CSA 35-AJ is
10	proposed under Article 8 of the County Service Area Law and to that end the Board is also, by
11	separate resolution today, declaring its intention to change the boundaries of CSA 35-AJ; and
12	WHEREAS, after the proposed boundary change, CSA 35-AJ would include the existing
13	territory of CSA 35-AJ, as well as the territory covered by Tentative Parcel Map 8160 and the
14	territory generally identified by APNs 580-010-11S, 580-010-12S, 580-010-14S, 580-010-15,
15	580-010-18S, 580-010-22, and 580-010-24 and more particularly identified by the map and
16	description attached as Exhibit A to this resolution; and
17	WHEREAS, a map and description of CSA 35-AJ with boundaries changed as proposed
18	is attached as Exhibit A to this resolution; and
19	WHEREAS, by separate resolution of the Board today the proposed boundary change
20	proceeding has been designated as CSA 35-AJ Boundary Change No. 3; and
21	WHEREAS, under Government Code section 25217.1, subdivision (d), before the Board
22	may finally approve CSA 35-AJ Boundary Change No. 3, a new benefit assessment to pay for
23	road maintenance services in CSA 35-AJ with boundaries changed as proposed must be
24	approved by owners of specially benefitted properties as required by Proposition 218 (California
25	Constitution, Article XIII D, section 4); and
26	WHEREAS, under Government Code section 25215.3, the Board may levy benefit
27	assessments in a county service area zone under the Benefit Assessment Act of 1982, Chapter
28	6.4 of Part 1 of Division 2 of Title 5 of the Government Code, beginning with section 54703

(1982 Act), and in compliance with Article XIII D, section 4, of the California Constitution to pay
 for the cost of road maintenance services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

**Section 1.** Each of the recitals above is true and correct.

5 Section 2. The Board hereby appoints and designates Hal Lore, PE – Lore
6 Engineering, Inc. as the assessment engineer (Assessment Engineer).

Section 3. The Assessment Engineer is hereby authorized and directed to make
and, no later than Wednesday, May 15, 2019, file with the Clerk to the Board a written report
regarding a benefit assessment to fund road maintenance services in CSA 35-AJ (collectively,
Engineer's Report). The Engineer's Report shall comply with the requirements of Government
Code sections 54711 and 54716 of the 1982 Act, and with Article XIII D, section 4, of the
California Constitution.

Section 4. A public meeting is hereby set for June 17, 2019, at 6:00 P.M. or as soon after as practicable, at the Woodward Park Regional Library, 944 East Perrin Avenue, Fresno, California 93720, for the public to give testimony concerning the proposed benefit assessment (collectively, Public Meeting). The Public Meeting may be continued from time to time by the County official conducting the Public Meeting without further notice by the Board, but in any event not later than eight days before the date set for the Public Hearing described in section 5 below.

20 Section 5. A public hearing of the Board is hereby set for July 9, 2019, at 9:00 A.M., 21 or as soon after as practicable, but in any case only after completion of the public 22 hearing on CSA 35-AJ Boundary Change No. 3, and only if there is no majority protest in 23 that boundary change hearing, in the meeting chambers of the Board, Hall of Records, 24 2281 Tulare Street, Third Floor, Fresno, California, 93721, for hearing all objections and 25 protests to the proposed benefit assessment as set forth in the Engineer's Report (collectively, 26 Public Hearing). The Public Hearing shall be held under Section 53753 of the California 27 Government Code. The Public Hearing may be continued from time to time by the Board 28 without further notice by the Board.

1 Section 6. The Board hereby authorizes and directs the Director of Public Works 2 and Planning (Director) or his designees, to prepare the assessment ballots, assessment ballot 3 instructions, materials for the change, withdrawal, or substitution of assessment ballots, including substitute assessment ballots and substitute assessment ballot instructions, any 4 5 materials for co-owner assessment ballots and co-owner assessment ballots, and any other forms and materials, as the Director or his designees deem necessary or appropriate, with 6 7 respect to the submission of assessment ballots by record property owners of the property in 8 CSA 35-AJ with boundaries changed as proposed, under Section 53753 of the California 9 Government Code.

10 Section 7. The Board hereby authorizes the Director or his designee to prepare a 11 joint notice of the Public Meeting and the Public Hearing (Joint Notices). Each of the Joint 12 Notices shall include the following: (a) the total amount of the proposed assessment chargeable 13 to the entire territory to be assessed, together with the proposed assessment formula or range; 14 (b) the amount chargeable to the record owner's parcel; (c) the duration, method and frequency 15 of the proposed assessment; (d) the reason for the assessment and basis upon which the 16 amount of the assessment was calculated; (e) the date, time, and place of the Public meeting; 17 and (f) the date, time, and place of the Public Hearing; (g) the contact information of an 18 individual, office, or organization that interested persons may contact to receive additional 19 information; (h) the address to which property owners may mail or deliver assessment ballots; (i) 20 an assessment ballot; (i) a summary of the procedures for the completion, return, and tabulation 21 of the assessment ballot; and (k) a statement that a finding of majority protest will cause the 22 assessment to be abandoned, and cause CSA 35-AJ Boundary Change No. 3 to be terminated. 23 Envelopes containing the Joint Notices must be labeled, in no smaller than 16-point bold type, 24 "OFFICIAL BALLOT ENCLOSED." The Director or his designee shall deliver the Joint Notices to 25 the Clerk of the Board no later than Monday, May 20, 2019.

Section 8. The Board hereby authorizes and directs the Clerk of the Board to sign
and mail, upon filing of the Engineer's Report and no later than Tuesday, May 21, 2019 the Joint
Notices to the record owners of the property to be assessed in CSA 35-AJ with boundaries


changed as proposed. Upon the Clerk of the Board's completion of the mailing of the Joint
 Notices (each of which shall contain an assessment ballot and assessment ballot instructions as
 described in section 6 of this resolution), the Clerk of the Board is hereby directed to file with the
 Board an affidavit setting forth the time and manner of compliance with the requirements of this
 section 8 for mailing the Joint Notices.


6 Section 9. In order for an assessment ballot to be counted, it must be properly 7 executed and must be delivered as follows: (i) by U.S. Mail so that it is received by the Clerk of 8 the Board no later than the date and time set for the Public Hearing; or (ii) otherwise delivered to 9 the Clerk of the Board no later than the date and time set for the Public Hearing; or (iii) delivered 10 at the Public Hearing, before the close of public testimony. If mailing or otherwise delivering 11 before the Public Hearing, the address for receipt shall be Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, 12 2281 Tulare Street, Room 301, Fresno, CA 93721. Assessment ballots are to remain 13 unopened and in the charge of the Clerk to the Board until they are opened and tabulated by the 14 Board's designated officials, after the conclusion of public testimony at the Public Hearing. 15 Assessment ballots may be withdrawn or changed at any time prior to the conclusion of the 16 Public Hearing.

17 Section 10. The Director of Public Works and Planning, and his designees, who may 18 be any employees of the County's Department of Public Works and Planning which he appoints, 19 are hereby designated and authorized to tabulate the assessment ballots (including substitute 20 assessment ballots and co-owner assessment ballots) submitted, and not withdrawn, in support 21 of or opposition to the assessment referred to in this resolution. Each of those persons may, in 22 their discretion appoint assistants, including, but not limited to, any employees of the County 23 Administrative Office, including further any employees of the Office of the Clerk of the Board, to 24 help tabulate the assessment ballots (including substitute assessment ballots and co-owner 25 assessment ballots). The Board hereby finds and determines that each of the persons 26 described in this Section 10 is an impartial person who does not have a vested interest in the 27 outcome of the assessment.

The Board hereby finds and determines that it took all of the foregoing 1 Section 11. actions and made all of the foregoing findings in full compliance with the law, including, without 2 limitation, the 1982 Act, the Proposition 218 Omnibus Implementation Act, and Article XIII D of 3 the California Constitution and any other law referred to in this resolution. 4 Section 12.
