County of Fresno Quarterly Activity Report

This report summarizes the agreement requirements between the County of Fresno and the Fresno County Economic Development Corporation (EDC).

Division Mission

To market Fresno County as the premier location for business prosperity.

Fresno County EDC Services

The Economic Development Corporation serving Fresno County is a nonprofit organization established to market Fresno County as the premier location for business prosperity. We facilitate site selection for new businesses within Fresno County, and assist in the retention and expansion of businesses through our alliance with collaborative partners and resources.

The EDC agrees to the following services:

- Provide site visits to businesses interested in locating in Fresno County. The EDC will report the number of site visits including names of the business (unless the business expressly requests to remain anonymous), type of industry, and location in the quarterly report to County;
- The EDC will provide technical assistance to businesses staying in Fresno County or expanding their operations;
- 3. The EDC will allow County access to industrial inventory. Please see www.fresnocountycities.com;
- 4. The EDC will maintain, monitor, and draft any required revisions of the County's Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) for approval by the County and help the County achieve the economic development objectives of the CEDS; and
- 5. The EDC, in coordination with the County Administrative Office, will help implement policies and programs from the Economic Development Element of the County of Fresno General Plan.

County of Fresno Economic Snapshot

Quarter 2, FY 18-19 Industrial, Office, and Retail Vacancy

In Fresno County this quarter, the industrial vacancy rate increased from 4.5% to 4.7%, the office vacancy rate decreased from 8.0% to 7.5%, and the retail vacancy rate increased from 5.2% to 5.6%.


November 2018 Unemployment Rates

This compares with an unadjusted unemployment rate of 3.9 percent for California and 3.5 percent for the nation during the same period.




Vacancy Rate - Industrial

Vacancy Rate - Retail





Client and Business Contact by Region



Burger King to locate in Firebaugh in 2019

The City of Firebaugh has made new retail development, including the establishment of national food retailers, a priority in their business attraction efforts. The EDC connected the City of Firebaugh with a California-based retail investment company, CIRE, who has coordinated similar QSR expansions across Fresno County, such as for Burger King. CIRE coordinated the development of a drive-thru only Burger King on 1185 N Street, Firebaugh. This will serve as the first Burger King location in the City with the hopes that it will draw in additional interest in Firebaugh from local and national retailers.

9RoundFitness

9Round Fitness, a gym that offers 30 minute kickboxing classes, will soon open their newest location in Fresno. The 9Round Fitness franchise owner approached EDC in April 2018 to assist with site selection and financing. EDC staff connected the franchisee with Access Plus Capital, SBA, SCORE and the Opportunity Fund to discuss unconventional financing opportunities. 9Round Fitness was able to secure the funds necessary to move forward with the opening of their first Central Valley location. Discussions have also been initiated to utilize the NEO program to fill their future hiring needs. Six employees will initially be hired at their northeast Fresno location.

Amazon Last Mile:

Amazon's Last Mile facility provides the final transfer of product distribution to consumers, in October 2018, Amazon announced that they secured a lease for 106,223 sf at 2325 S. Cedar Avenue, which will support 200 new jobs. Amazon's Last Mile facility serves as the first of its kind in California.

Excelsior Integrated, Inc.:

Excelsior Integrated is a third party logistics (e-commerce logistics) company based out of Massachusetts. They service approximately 80-100 small to medium-sized businesses (some of the business are seasonal only). The Fresno site is their second shipping facility on the West Coast as they are distributing to 5-6 regional businesses.

NutriAg:

EDC assisted NutriAg in securing a California Competes Tax Credit of \$180,000. The credit will support 13 new jobs and \$1,625,000 in project investment in the Biola community. NutriAg, a crop nutrient manufacturer based in Toronta, Canada, has been working on a 20,000 sf expansion project in the unincorporated community of Biola. NutriAg supplies nutrient products and agricultural adjuvants under their patents, trademarks and private label to distributors and dealers worldwide.

PROJECT PONY EXPRESS LEAD UPDATE

During Quarter 4 (2017-2018), the EDC submitted a comprehensive packet for consideration for Project Pony Express, which represented a company looking to locate a Greenfield auto-manufacturing plant in the United States, providing 3,000 new jobs and \$600 million in investment. Following the submission, we were notified that Fresno County was the only community shortlisted in California for further consideration and would be included in the client's upcoming site visits.

In November, we were notified by the Governor's office that the client decided not to consider Fresno, or the West Coast any longer due to several domestic and international policy implications surrounding the signing of a new trade agreement on November 30, 2018 between the United States, Mexico and Canada, known as USMCA. The client's site selector/engineering consultant provided the following reasons below:

- USMCA calls for higher local content requirements (from 62.5% to 75%), and according to the client, the change would significantly impact their complete supply chain.
- Uncertainties and risk surround potential tariff increases to 25%, impacting their import of auto components for production. Thus, Eastern Europe, Thailand and China have been elevated for further consideration.

Lack of Tier 1 and Tier 2 suppliers, and due to additional local content requirements, original equipment manufacturers (OEMs) would need to use even more nearby suppliers. Without adequate suppliers, logistics costs increase significantly for the client.

Marketing

The EDC continues to participate in trade shows/missions in partnership with the California Central Valley Economic Development Corporation (CCVEDC) and Team California to promote Fresno County and its 15 cities.

Americas Competitiveness Exchange

The tenth session of the Americas Competitiveness Exchange (ACE 10) was held in Fresno on October 24. ACE 10 brought 48 high-ranking government officials, business, and academic leaders representing 24 countries, to Fresno to learn more about the innovation happening in the Valley and how their countries can partner within the region.

High-Speed Rail

Since the program inception in 2013, the EDC has assisted 232 property owners throughout the City of Fresno. During this quarter our Business Support Specialists assisted 14 businesses and property owners, making contact 34 times.

Highlights

Implanta IT Solutions

Department of Commerce and EDC hosted Brazilian-based Implanta IT Solutions, here on an agriculture innovation award that allowed them to explore the agriculture and IT industries in California's Silicon Valley and Central Valley. Their technology product connects farmers and investors for a more efficient transfer of goods and financing.

Israel Ag Tech

EDC received an inquiry from the Director of Trade and Business Development with the Government of Israel's Economic Mission to the West Coast. The agency requested assistance in locating companies and partners for a trade mission of fifteen Israeli agriculture technology companies. Fresno Farm Bureau hosted the group whom pitched their ideas and products to agriculture industry professionals.

Fresno Energy Watch Program

The Fresno Energy Watch Program continues to actively promote its services through social media platforms, partnership collaborations and in-person outreach. The marketing and promotional efforts have yielded 12 program referrals in November.

CPUC Letter of Opposition-Public Comment

EDC provided a letter of opposition regarding the proposed taxation of text messaging services for public welfare programs brought forth by the CPUC. Due to the measure's unpopularity and unprecedented proposal, CPUC removed the item from their agenda.

Zero Mass Water

Zero Mass Water, a startup water production technology company, met with EDC staff as a part of their introduction to the San Joaquin Valley. Zero Mass Water has patented technology that produces potable water through solar powered hydropanels. EDC assisted in coordinating meetings with the City of Orange Cove, Self Help Enterprises and others. The parent company operates in Arizona and has distribution partners in 17 countries. They are looking to expand into the Central Valley and want to establish preliminary projects that will serve a community function, highlight the use of the product, and provide data on the water production ability in parts of the valley.

Coworking Spaces

Fresno County EDC met with the Reedley Executive Center (REC) and the Launchpad at River Park. Both facilities are opportunities for micro and small businesses to optimize shared workspaces with various on and off site business support activities. REC is the first of its kind in the rural eastern region of Fresno County. REC plans to reach maximum capacity by March 2019 and would like to complete construction on portions of the space by end of January. The Launchpad at River Park offers a north west Fresno option for those seeking coworking space north of Herndon Avenue. The site is unique with some attached warehouse space at the rear of the facility for a single user. The trend in coworking spaces continues to grow in the county and has an opportunity to serve as incubation space for micro businesses that can potentially have, over time, high economic impact. The main location noted in Fresno has been Bitwise but recent additions such as Her Space, Common Space, and Vision View have become supportive hubs for their clients.

Cen Cal Partners Meeting

EDC presented at the 2018 Cen Cal Partners Meeting in San Luis Obispo. The presentation included a segment on how EDC leverages the Trade Professional Alliance Program in order to serve contractors and facilitate opportunities for businesses to expand and retain their operations in the region. In other related work, EDC is currently working with PG&E Trade Professional Alliance Program Manager to gather and analyze data based on activity generated through PG&E and EDC efforts, which will facilitate the analysis of the program's impact on the Fresno County region.

PG&E Launches Enhanced Economic Development Rate

To ensure their territory's cost competitiveness, PG&E received approval by the California Public Utilities Commission to renew and expand their Economic Development Rate (EDR), which provides eligible companies up to a 25% rate reduction in their electricity costs over five years. Most importantly, the new EDR reduces the capacity requirements, therefore small businesses below 150kW may qualify. Prior availability was limited to businesses with loads of at least 200kW. Thus, many more companies looking to locate in Fresno County, expand their operations, or keep their doors open may now be eligible. EDC was proud to work alongside PG&E in advocating for the renewal and expansion of the EDR, and we are excited to retain this incentive that provides a competitive advantage.
