**RESOLUTION NO. 19-350** 

WHEREAS, Every year, communities throughout the United States experience emergencies from unforeseen natural disasters to deliberate acts, but unfortunately many of us are not prepared for emergencies that threaten our lives, property and our Nation's security; and

WHEREAS, The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) first declared September as "National Preparedness Month" in 2004 as part of their Ready Campaign with the goal to educate and empower Americans to have a plan in place in the event of a crisis; and

WHEREAS, This year's theme is "Prepared, Not Scared", with a weekly focus on different aspects of preparedness such as financial preparedness, creating a family plan, youth awareness and community involvement; and

WHEREAS, FEMA's Ready Campaign, Citizen Corps, Fresno County Office of Emergency Services and other federal state, local, private and non-profit agencies are working to increase public activities in preparing for emergencies and provide valuable resources; and

**WHEREAS,** The American Red Cross, through its strong network of volunteers, donors and partners, is always there in times of need, providing Fresno County residents with care, shelter and hope in times of disaster;

**WHEREAS**, The Central California Animal Disaster Team helps our community to be prepared for disasters by working closely with emergency response agencies to ensure families who are evacuated have safe shelters for pets;

WHEREAS, United Way of Fresno and Madera Counties provides an informational resource through its 2-1-1 helpline that connects people with agencies and organizations in their critical time of need to provide essential services such as emergency shelter and food services; and; and

WHEREAS, By participating in "National Preparedness Month", the County of Fresno has the opportunity to join the Nation and State of California in strengthening community and regional resiliency; and

WHEREAS, "National Preparedness Month" is an important reminder and opportunity for every resident in Fresno County to prepare their homes, businesses and communities for any type of disaster.
