Budget Narrative

The electronic Suspected Child Abuse Report System (eSCARS) Project budget supports one Information Technology Analyst (Department of Social Services) and one Business Systems Analyst (Department of Social Services) position for project development and one Paralegal (District Attorney) for guidance in the implementation of the project. All items included in the budget are devoted 100% to "project" activity.

This budget directs 92% of the \$250,000 total cost to salaries and benefits in direct support of the project. Salaries and benefits make up 92% of the budget and fund Analyst positions to assist in the project development and the Paralegal who will facilitate eSCARS activity for the District Attorney's Office. This budget directs 8% of the available funds to Operating expenses as required by the RFP to collaborate with the Los Angeles County DCFS on guidance in the development and implementation of eSCARS.

The Analyst positions are in the process of developing the project interface and the Sheriff's Department will assist with the 13 allied law enforcement agencies who utilize the Sheriff's case management system.

The new eSCARS system is still in the process of being developed. However, the eSCARS reports are reviewed by the Paralegal to determine whether the report resulted in a criminal filing. If there is an open Child Abuse/Sexual Assault case, the paralegal will forward it to the assigned prosecutor. The Paralegal will be responsible for monitoring the eSCARS website daily, forward eSCARS to prosecutors, and conduct follow-up with Law Enforcement Agencies.

The new E-SCAR system is being designed with the assistance of both Analyst positions in the Department of Social Services and implemented by the Paralegal will greatly increase the number of SCAR reports that are received and reviewed by the D.A.'s Office and will eliminate the chance of "hardcopy" SCAR being lost or misplaced. When eSCARS are

received with no criminal prosecution pending, the Paralegal will be able to instantly check Law Enforcement's status with the case. In appropriate cases, the Paralegal will be able to contact Law Enforcement to request follow-up on cases that need further investigation. The abovementioned Analyst and Paralegal positions as supported in the budget are well positioned to effectively achieve the stated goals of the project.

This project will not require subcontractors or have any unusual expenditures.

Program staff does not have a planned cost of living adjustment for 2019-20.

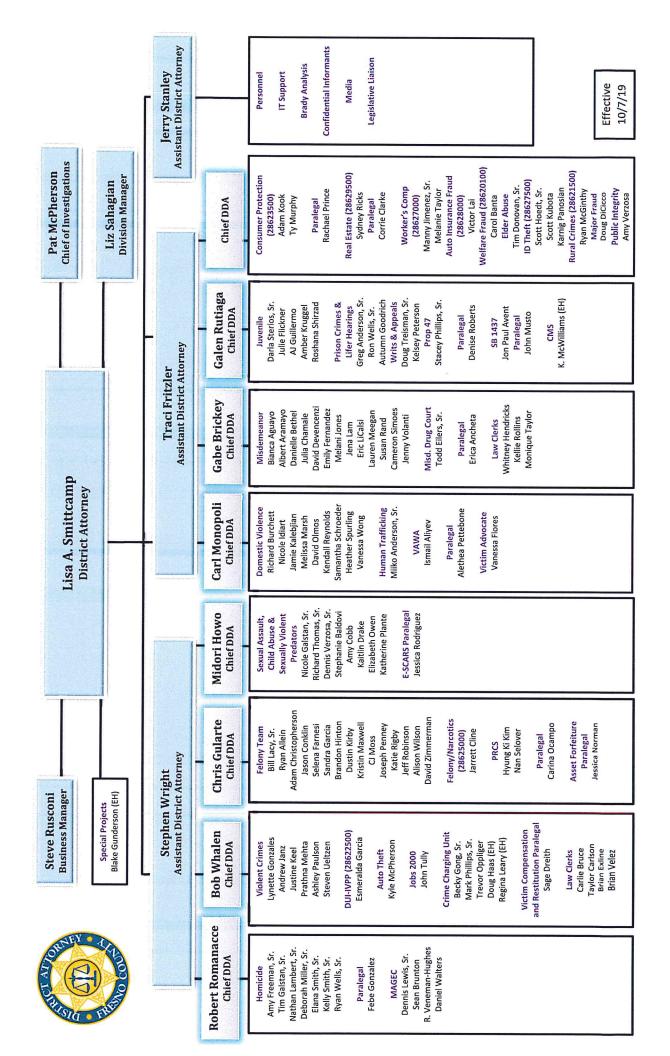
