Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act Funding Expenditures Update

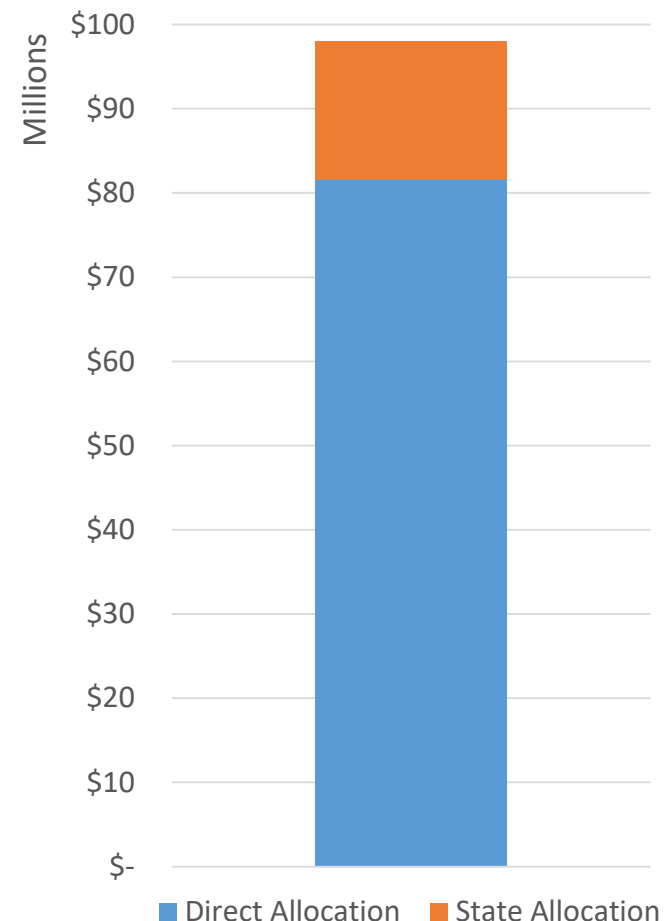

- Declared Local County and Public Health Emergency on March 15, 2020
- Stood Up County Emergency Operations Center (EOC) and Department of Public Health Department Operations Center (DOC) on March 16, 2020
- BOS ratified Emergency Declaration on March 17, 2020 and directed CAO and Public Health to “Do what you need to do”
- Accepted CARES Act funding in Board Action on April 28, 2020.
- Provided CARES Act Funding Update to Board of Supervisors on July 4, 2020

Available Funding

3

- Fresno County received \$81,579,507 in funding from the CARES Act on April 22, 2020
- State of California FY 2020-21 allocates an additional \$16,438,000 of State's share of CARES Act funding
- Total of \$98,017,507 CARES Act funding available



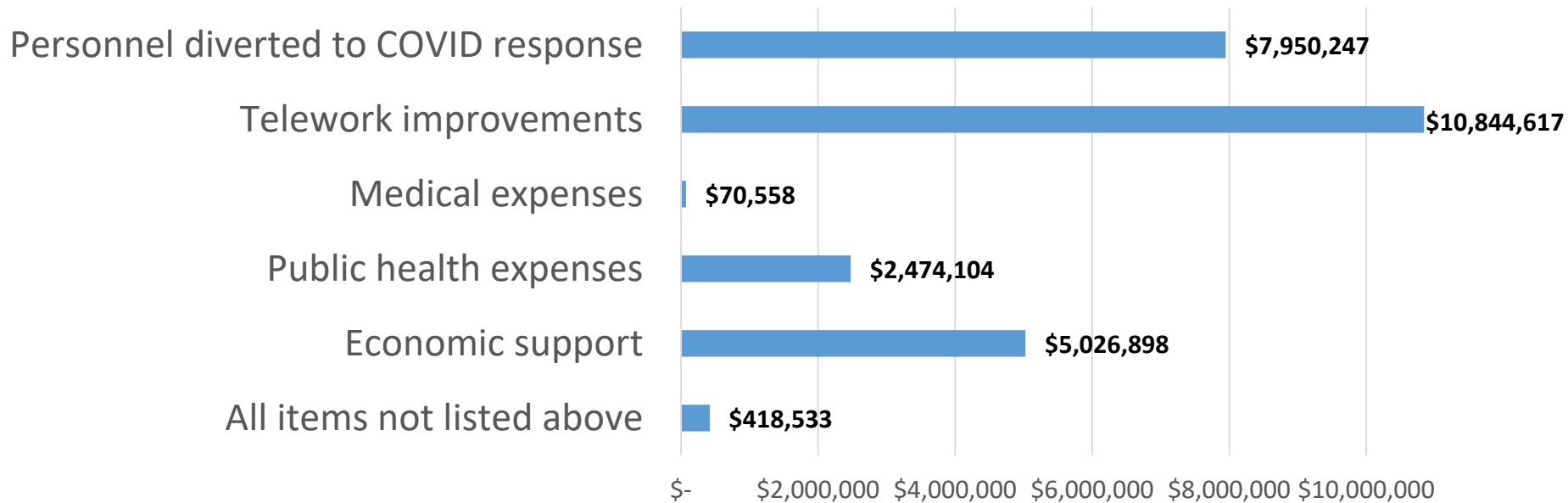
Three General Requirements for Expenses:

- 1) Necessary expenses incurred due to the public health emergency with respect to COVID-19 only;
 - 2) Expenses were not incurred for within the most recently approved County budget as of March 27, 2020
 - 3) Eligible expenses are incurred between March 1, 2020, and December 30, 2020
- The CARES Act specifically excludes the ability of state and local governments to use these COVID relief funds to replace revenue shortfalls resulting from COVID-19

- Through June 30, 2020, the County has incurred expenses totaling \$26,784,957 in response to the COVID-19 health emergency in the following categories:
