





Tier 1 - January

- Acute care, psychiatric and correctional facility hospitals
- Skilled nursing facilities, assisted living facilities, and similar settings for older or medically vulnerable individuals
- Paramedics, EMTs and others providing emergency medical services
- Dialysis Centers
- Long term care facilities

Vaccinating NOW

Tier 2 - January

- Intermediate care facilities for persons who need continuous nursing supervision and supportive care
- Public health field staff
- Primary care clinics, including Federally Qualified Health Centers, Rural Health Centers, correctional facility clinics, and urgent care clinics
- Home health care and in-home supportive services
- Community health workers, including promotoras

Vaccinating NEXT

Tier 3 - January

- Specialty clinics
- Laboratory workers
- Dental and other oral health clinics
- Pharmacy staff not working in settings at higher tiers

Tier 1 - February

- Individuals 75 +
- Food and Agriculture
- Education and Childcare
- **Emergency Services**
- Homeless/unhoused

Tier 2 - March

- Individuals 65 + (with underlying medical conditions)
- Incarcerated individualsjails/prisons
 - Transportation and logistics
- Critical manufacturina
 - Industrial, commercial, residential and sheltering facilities

April

Individuals 50-74 years of age

16-49 years with underlying medical conditions/disabilities that place them at high risk for severe COVID-19 illness and death

- Water and waste management, defense, energy, chemical and hazardous, communication and IT, financial services
- Government operations/community services

DISTRIBUTION OF VACCINES

Phase 1a approximately 58,000 Healthcare Workers (Mid-December - February 2021)

- ► Tier 1 Hospital Staff, Skilled Nursing Facilities, Paramedics, EMTs, Jail Medical Staff, Inpatient Psychiatric, Dialysis Centers
- ► Tier 2 -Home Health Care, In-Home Supportive Services, Community Health Workers, Public Health Field Staff, Primary Care clinics, FQHCs, Rural Health Centers, Urgent care
- Tier 3 Specialty clinics, Laboratory Workers, Pharmacy, Dental clinics

Phase 1b approximately 262,000 Essential Workers & Medically Vulnerable (February-March 2021)

- ▶ Tier 1 Food and Ag, Education & Childcare, Emergency Services, 75+
- ► Tier 2 65-74 w/chronic disease, Incarcerated individuals, Homeless, Transportation & Logistics, Industrial, Residential, Commercial, Critical Manufacturing

Phase 1c - Essential Workers & Medically Vulnerable (April 2021)


▶ 65-74, 16-64 w/chronic disease, Water and Waste Management, Defense, Energy, Chemical and Hazardous, Communication and IT, Financial Services, Government Operations, Community Services
