PREFACE:

This RFQ is for professional on-call environmental consultant services necessary for various public works projects in the County of Fresno. These services will generally consist of, but are not necessarily limited to, the biological, jurisdictional waters, water quality, cultural, hazardous waste, farmland, noise, air quality, visual and community impact technical reports, memoranda and associated field work and coordination, in accordance with the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) Standard Environmental Reference (SER) for federally funded transportation projects. From time to time, environmental support services could be required for non-federal projects such as California State Revolving Fund projects or projects funded through a federal grant. Services could also include the preparation of a Preliminary Environmental Study (PES) form, California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) documents and/or regulatory agency permit applications and coordination, swallow and bat exclusion plans and services, lead and asbestos testing, worker environmental awareness training, biological or cultural construction monitoring, preconstruction biological/species surveys, revegetation plans, land use planning and climate-related studies.

It is the intent of the County to enter into agreement with seven (7) to ten (10) qualified consultants to provide the professional services described herein. However, the County reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to terminate this RFQ process or negotiations with a selected consultant and either perform the work with its staff or begin a new RFQ process. Nothing herein, or in the process, shall be construed as having obligated the County to pay for any expenses incurred by respondents to this RFQ, or to the selected consultants prior to Board of Supervisors' approval of a consultant services agreement.

The maximum term of the Agreement will be five years. The maximum total dollar amount for all agreements awarded is an aggregate of \$5,000,000. The total fees paid to the consultant will be dependent upon the professional services performed for the projects. No guarantee is made that the total fee or any fee will be received by the consultant.

IMPORTANT: If your firm submits a SOQ and is selected for an interview, it is anticipated that all interviews will be held during the week of November 17, 2025.

I. GENERAL INFORMATION

The Department is seeking qualified environmental consultants to provide on-call services which will generally consist of, but are not necessarily limited to, the preparation of technical reports and memoranda in accordance with Caltrans' SER for federally funded transportation projects, non-federally funded transportation projects or non-transportation projects. Services

could also include the preparation of a PES form, CEQA documents and/or regulatory agency permit applications.

These services will be provided through a Consultant Services Agreement (hereinafter referred to as “the Agreement”) for various public works projects (hereinafter referred to as “projects”). Projects may include, but are not limited to, road reconstruction, road widening, bridge replacement, bridge rehabilitation, bike/pedestrian paths, traffic signal design, traffic calming, hydraulic analysis, water treatment and distribution systems, and wastewater treatment plants.

If any consultant does not have adequate resources to perform all of the professional services, subconsultants may be retained to perform services at the agreed upon rates attached as an exhibit to the Agreement. Single service firms are eligible to submit a proposal for this RFQ. The Department reserves the right to approve all subconsultants.

The provisions of 49 CFR, Part 26 ("Participation by Disadvantaged Business Enterprises in Department of Transportation Financial Assistance Programs") require that a local agency receiving federal-aid funds complies with the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) program, and that DBE firms have an opportunity to participate in the projects. Fresno County has established an overall DBE goal of 19% for this Agreement. This is pending Caltrans approval and may be revised during the advertisement of this RFP. Non-DBE proposers are encouraged to retain DBE subconsultants. It is the Consultant's responsibility to be fully informed regarding the requirements of 49 CFR, Part 26 and the State of California Department of Transportation's Race Conscious DBE program developed pursuant to the regulations (See Attachment A, Notice to Proposers DBE Information).

Consultants should be aware that the provisions of 49 CFR, Part 26 and the County's DBE Program may apply during the course of the consulting contract and would require reporting on the part of the consultant in the event a work activity requires the participation of a subconsultant other than one originally listed by the consultant and which is approved by the County. Additionally, projects funded by a federal grant or loan would require compliance with the DBE program specifically established by the funding federal agency or program.

Respondents to this RFQ are encouraged to review the County's Liability Insurance and Indemnification Requirements in the Sample Agreement, attached hereto as Attachment I. These requirements are not subject to negotiation.

If an Agreement is successfully negotiated with your firm, consultants and Agreements may be selected for Caltrans audit and review through the risk-based approach described in Chapter 10, Consultant Selection, Caltrans Local Assistance Procedures Manual (LAPM). Potential audits or reviews can include, but are not limited to, the Agreement, incurred cost

and indirect cost rate audits, financial management system review, and risk assessments. The consultant's financial management system shall comply with 48 CFR, Federal Acquisitions Regulation Systems requirements and other regulations and guidance listed in the LAPM. If audited by Caltrans Audits and Investigations and modifications to the Agreement and fee schedule are recommended, the documents shall be modified to conform to the audit and review recommendations.

If an On-Call Agreement is successfully negotiated with your firm, your firm may be asked to provide professional services on an on-call basis. Typically, the Contract Administrator will send the consultants a request for proposal for a specific service/project (task order). This task order will include a description of the professional services needed, a detailed project description, location map and other relevant material the Department is able to provide. Based on the information provided by the Department, the consultants will be asked to provide a detailed scope of work, or refined scope of work to better address the needs of the Department, staff qualifications, an estimated time schedule, and a fee proposal in a separate sealed envelope or password protected PDF file.

Upon reviewing the proposals, the Department's representative will rank the consultants based on their proposals and qualifications. Once the most qualified consultant is identified, the fee proposal will be opened and negotiated with the top ranked consultant. If negotiations are unsuccessful, the Department will discontinue negotiations with the top ranked consultant and begin negotiations with the second ranked consultant. Final authorization shall be provided in writing. Once written authorization is given, the consultant shall perform the required service within the agreed upon parameters.

The term of the Agreement will be for a maximum of five years. Compensation shall be calculated as specified in the Agreement and Fee Schedule (See the LAPM for instructions). The fee schedule will be in effect for the duration of the Agreement, unless the consultant exercises the optional provision to adjust the rates once annually for inflation. The consultant shall initiate the rate adjustment process by submitting a proposed adjusted fee schedule to the Contract Administrator for review and approval. Specific project work may be transferred to another consultant if work is not concluded by the end of the Agreement.

Where specific functions are required by law to be performed by the County or where specific functions are listed in the Agreement as to be performed by the County, County staff will perform the actual work function.

Qualified firms are encouraged to submit a SOQ. Firms can submit for any or all of the disciplines listed. Single discipline firms are eligible for this RFQ.

III. SERVICES REQUIRED OF CONSULTANT

- A. Consultant services requested on a proposal may include, but are not limited to:

 3. Reviewing engineering reports or other technical studies from the Department
 4. Reviewing project permits
 5. Identifying the components and requirements of a project
 6. Advising the Department if the scope of work requested seems inaccurate, incomplete, or inadvisable for a Project
 7. Conducting a site investigation to determine existing field conditions
 8. Submitting a written proposal, including a scope of work, a not-to-exceed fee proposal, and a schedule
 9. Land Use and Transportation Planning, including preparation of various studies, community and regional plan updates, truck route study, and land use application processing
 10. Road Safety Planning
 11. Climate Adaptation planning

12. California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) documentation and preparation
13. Grant writing/preparation assistance

2. Providing the following Preconstruction / Construction Related Services:

3. Providing the following Permit Assistance:
 - a) Prepare, review and/or advise Department regarding regulatory agency permits
4. Providing the following General Services:
 - a) Verifying and incorporating Caltrans, regulatory agency and Department requirements in documents prepared by your firm

- b) Responding to comments from Caltrans, regulatory agencies and the Department regarding documents prepared by your firm
- c) Consulting, communicating and meeting with Caltrans, regulatory agencies and the Department to verify, refine, and complete the Project. The consultant will prepare and submit meeting minutes to the Department within seven (7) working days.
- d) Submitting electronic draft and final documents capable of being opened by Adobe Acrobat and Microsoft Word, Excel, and PowerPoint. The standard submittal will be one electronic copy for each draft and final document; however, other agency reviews may require paper submittals, the number of which will be determined by the specifics of each Project. The consultant shall verify the required quantity and format with the Department prior to submittal.

5. Staff Augmentation Services

- a) Providing experienced, part-time or full-time staff to perform any of the duties which would otherwise be performed by experienced County staff. This service may be required to be performed in a County facility.

IV. SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE DEPARTMENT

Services provided by the department shall include, but are not necessarily limited to the following:

- A. Provide a Contract Administrator
- B. Provide a project description, location map, description of services, and other relevant material the Department can provide for each task order
- C. Examine documents submitted and render timely decisions pertaining thereto

V. SOQ SUBMITTAL REQUIREMENTS

The submittal shall be in two parts.

- A. The first part will enable the County to appraise the general competence and qualifications of the consultant. Please provide the listed information in the following sequence:

6. Key personnel who may work on Projects with their educational background, credentials, and experience on comparable Projects
7. Subconsultants to be used, if any, and their experience in their respective fields. Indicate the tasks to be performed by these subconsultants
8. List of current staff, including job classification
9. Firm qualifications
10. Firm organization chart
11. List current projects or commitments in your office
12. List, in reverse chronological order, projects completed by your firm in the last four years. The projects should be related to the category or categories of services your firm is proposing to provide. Indicate the following for each:
 - a) Name of project
 - b) Project location(s)
 - c) Brief description
 - d) Name of owner
 - e) Name of owner's contact person and telephone number
 - f) Your firm's specific involvement
 - g) Status of completion.
13. List the name and phone number of at least four additional client references.
14. Include the following statement: “[Firm Name] has reviewed the sample agreement associated with this RFQ and, if selected, can enter into an agreement of that form.”

B. The second part will allow the County to examine the consultant’s potential for using subconsultants to provide the services outlined in this RFQ. Please list portions of work that could potentially be completed by a DBE subconsultant under this Agreement. The Agreement will have an overall DBE goal of 19%. Please complete the Exhibit 10-O2, Local Agency Proposer DBE Information (Consultant Contracts) from the LAPM (See Attachment A to this RFQ). This document will be included as an Exhibit to the Agreement upon a successful negotiation. Please note, however, that the ability to identify and utilize DBE subconsultants will not be used as criteria for selecting on-call consultants.

VI. CONSULTANT SELECTION PROCEDURE

The selection procedure shall be in accordance with the Fresno County Ordinance Code Chapter 4.10 and applicable provisions of the “Policy for Selection and Compensation of

Architectural/Engineering Consultants” as revised by the Board of Supervisors on October 2, 2007, and Chapter 10 Consultant Selection in Caltrans LAPM. The Department’s selection policy and appeal process can be found at: <https://www.fresnocountyca.gov/Departments/Public-Works-and-Planning/Request-For-Proposals>. The LAPM can be found at: <https://dot.ca.gov/programs/local-assistance/guidelines-and-procedures/local-assistance-procedures-manual-lapm>.

A Selection Committee (hereinafter referred to as the “Committee”) will be formed to evaluate the SOQs and to make recommendations to the Fresno County Board of Supervisors. The Committee will consist of representatives of the Department, other County of Fresno Departments, outside agencies or private companies if considered necessary or desirable for the selection process. The Committee will screen the SOQs to narrow consideration to those firms with qualifications and experience deemed especially qualified for this commission. These firms may be invited to participate in interviews prior to a final selection.

The Committee will address the following criteria in its evaluation of the SOQs and will use an Evaluation Sheet to systematically review the SOQs (See Attachment C).

- A. Educational background of the consultant’s key individuals
- B. Experience with an emphasis on environmental services related to typical Public Works projects
- C. Quality of past performance for the County or similar agencies
- D. Qualifications of individual(s), within the consultant's organization, directly responsible for the work. The Department reserves the right of approval of the consultant's project manager
- E. Adequacy of staff to perform the work within the time allowed
- F. Demonstrated ability to make effective public presentations
- G. Demonstrated ability to work effectively with County staff, other public agencies and related parties
- H. New or innovative ideas presented
- I. Knowledge of local conditions, where appropriate
- J. Demonstrated ability to keep costs within project budget and estimates

The County reserves the right to conduct a background inquiry of each Respondent which may include collection of appropriate criminal history information, contractual and business associations and practices, employment histories and reputation in the business community. By submitting a SOQ to the County, the Respondent consents to such an inquiry and agrees to make available to the County such books and records the County deems necessary to conduct the inquiry.

VII. CONSULTANT FEES AND FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

An Agreement shall not be awarded to a consultant without an adequate financial management and accounting system as required by 48 CFR Part 16.301-3, 49 CFR Part 18, and 48 CFR Part 31. If your firm is selected for an interview, your firm will be asked to submit, in a **password protected PDF**, your specific rates of compensation fee schedule and a completed Certification of Indirect Costs and Financial Management System (Attachment D) form for your firm and each of your proposed subconsultants. Interviews are expected to be conducted via online teleconference, so the fee schedule and completed Certification form will be submitted electronically in a password protected file.

Questions and Answers

Are we able to submit a Statement of Qualifications for just one of the environmental services ((g) arborist evaluation), or will we be required to partner with a prime that is submitting for all of them?

You can submit a proposal for just one (or more) type of service, it is not expected that firms provide every service (or have subconsultants perform every service).

Considering the recent change at the federal level, would you please confirm that the 19% DBE goal noted within the RFQ will not be applicable to this contract?

See Addendum 1, there is no DBE goal for this project.

Under Article V. SOQ Submittal Requirements on page 7, #10. Firm Organization Chart: Do you want us to provide a key personnel organization chart or an organization chart of our firm?

Please provide a "key personnel" organization chart.

There are two attachments mentioned in the RFQ, but not stated as an item needed under Article V. SOQ Submittal Requirements (page 7), please confirm if we need to complete the forms and include them in our submittal. If we do need to include the forms, please confirm if just the prime or if the subconsultants need to submit, as well.

- a. **Debarment and Suspension Certification**
- b. **Exhibit 10-Q, Disclosure of Lobbying Activities.**

You and your subconsultants can submit them with the proposal OR for the final executed contract if your firm is selected.

For Article V. SOQ Submittal Requirements, A. First Part, 8. List of current staff, including job classification, would the County like a list of staff that would potentially work on your projects?

Yes, this should include key personnel and current staff that would potentially work on County projects and will be included as an exhibit in the Agreement. It can be amended as needed.

The County would like the SOQ submitted in two parts. Can the two parts be combined into one pdf file?

For Article V. SOQ Submittal Requirements, B. Second Part is no longer required. See Addendum 1.

The County requests completion of Exhibit 10-O2. Since there are no dollar amounts associated with this agreement, should consultants submit 10-O1 instead?

The DBE forms 10-O1, 10-O2 are no longer required. See Addendum 1.

Under Article V. Submittal Requirements, the County is requesting that consultants provide a list of completed projects in the last four years. Since this list could be quite long and services could extend to project types outside of public works projects, would it be acceptable to include just public works projects? Also, regarding the contacts for some of these projects, what should consultants do if the public agency or prime consultant project managers have left their positions or have retired and there is no current contact for them?

List all projects in the last four years where project locations are in California and the projects were worked on by your proposed key personnel. Provide the best available contact information for the agencies/departments.

The RFQ lists a mailing address and an office address for the County. Is there a preference of which address consultants should use on the cover page and cover letter?

Use the firm's preferred address they would like identified in the agreement, if awarded.

Is the County seeking full resumes to be included in the proposal?

The format is not specified so you may use the format of your choice (resumes, summaries, paragraphs, etc.) to convey educational background, credentials, and experience on comparable projects for your key personnel.

Rate Schedule Submission: Our understanding is that the cost proposal is not required as part of the technical qualifications submission. Instead, a cost proposal (Attachment E) and the Certification of Indirect Costs and Financial Management System (Attachment D) form will be requested if our firm is selected for an interview. Could you please confirm that this is correct?

If your firm is selected for an interview, your firm will be asked to submit, in a password protected PDF, your specific rates of compensation fee schedule and a completed Certification of Indirect Costs and Financial Management System (Attachment D) form for your firm and each of your proposed subconsultants.

Are Attachments C to G required to be submitted with the proposal?

No. The required information to be submitted for the RFQ is listed in Article V. SOQ Submittal Requirements, A. First Part.

Can Key Staff Resumes be included as an appendix to create a cleaner proposal?

The format is not specified so you may use the format of your choice.

Could the County clarify which forms are required from prime consultants and which are required for subconsultants?

The following forms will be required by you and your subconsultants and can be submitted with the proposal OR for the final executed contract if your firm is selected. No forms are required to be submitted with the proposal.
